

I find it so comforting that we aren't expected to always choose correctly! On Rosh Hashana, we recognize Hashem



as King of the Universe, the one fair Judge that has the infinite capacity to see what we cannot. On this same day we also commemorate the birth of humankind, a birth where on the same day Adam and Eve were created by G-d, they also betrayed His wishes. And while there were consequences, we all still have gotten to exist through this and countless other sins, confirming that we have a chance.

> Furthermore, we are given Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement, to atone and repent fully for our shortcomings.

> I take deep comfort in the fact that while my own reason does not suffice to shepherd me through this precious, but sharp, poignant existence, I understand that *Hashem* is King and is the Ultimate Judge. He is One infallible that is presiding over all, and I am relieved to acknowledge His Kingship on Rosh Hashana, and be

grateful that despite everything, we exist, and that we are given an opportunity to repent.

I used to find it crushingly intimidating outside that bubble of 0s and 1s but thankfully Hashem runs the universe, something none of us are qualified to do. We are simply asked to serve Hashem, and if we do so, Hashem will take care of us all.
