CHANUKAH IS HERE ONCE MORE

When I was three years old, I was in a Chanukah play at the Jewish Community Center in Wilmington, Delaware. I still remember the lines I delivered to two hundred people. "Chanukah is here once more. We'll buy candles at the store." I got an ovation. (But not a standing ovation.)

The home I came from was a traditional home that observed the holidays and kashruth. But my early education was in the public school system. However, when I was 15 years old, I went to a camp run by observant Jews who said I belonged in a yeshiva. And so, for the last two years of high school and several years thereafter, I went to a yeshiva.

Eventually, however, I went to the University of Delaware, and after graduation moved to New York and became a "three day a year Jew." Holidays, Shabbat and Kashrut, vanished. Oh, yes, I did light Chanukah ndles.

About five years ago, I was walking past Lincoln Square Synagogue and saw a poster for Rabbi Buchwald's Crash Course in Judaism. I don't know why I went in, but I did. It was interesting. No, it was more than interesting. It was a

wonderful talk on the basics of Jewish belief. He explained things in a way that I had never heard before. He spoke about the moral and ethical side of the commandments. He opened my eyes to a Judaism that related to the world I live in. One of the things Rabbi Buchwald emphasized that stuck in my mind, was the numerous times the Torah repeats the command to be kind to strangers—because we (Jews) were strangers in the land of Egypt.

The Torah repeats this injunction, to be exact, thirty six times. I have often thought-why 36 times?? Finally, I concluded that certainly one of the most difficult things for a person to do, is to be kind to those who are different from us. Torah, with its profound iderstanding of the human psyche, emphasized and re-emphasized this commandment to firmly implant this sense of caring and empathy in our individual and

national consciousness.

So, I started to attend the Beginners Service. Why would a yeshiva boy go to a Beginners Service? When you have been away for twenty years you have to get back to the basics.

Then Rabbi Buchwald suggested I take a class with Rabbi Simcha Weinberg. Great idea! I was immediately turned on to Rabbi Weinberg and what he was teaching. I learned from him how to let the Torah talk to me and how to talk to the Torah. I learned to question, to probe, and to ruminate. Torah study became alive, exciting, dynamic, creative and

meaningful. My mind got sharper. (Maybe you CAN teach an old dog new tricks.)

One more thing. The people I met at the Beginners Service were into working on improving their moral and ethical character. They were very concerned, for example, about Loshon Hara (evil speech). Once I visited the home of someone who had a sign posted on his door which read "No Loshon Hara spoken here." Gradually, impressed by these excellent role models, I also began to develop a greater sensitivity for proper speech.

Can you think of a better group of people by whom to be stimulated?

So, what does all this have to do with my acting debut at age three? On Chanukah we use the shammash (the servant candle) to light the other candles. And I guess that's what has happened to me. I realized that you have to pass on what you know. And so, over the past several years, I have helped the rabbi and lay leaders in Wilmington develop a Beginners Service, and from this I hope many more candles will be lit.

I'm sorry, I have to go now, because: "Chanukah is here once more, and I have to buy candles at the store."
