
TASHLICH by Warren Rich

It was Rosh Hashanah afternoon at the Hudson River in New York City. I had just closed my High Holiday prayer book after casting my bread upon the waters. It was a clear, sunny afternoon and, as I reflected upon the many good things of the past year, and looked forward with anticipation to the new year, a familiar voice asked if she could use my siddur.

"Of course," I said, as I turned. It was Roslyn Dickens, one of those beautiful people who had come back to Judaism with a passion, through Rabbi Buchwald's Beginners Service. We spoke a bit, and the mood was just right, as it always is when sharing thoughts about "Effie" Buchwald.

I shared some of my experiences with Roslyn. One of the most vivid was an episode in classroom 2. I had just finished a Basic Judaism Course with the Rabbi. He came over and congratulated me on the contract I

had signed to play at the Essex House, but wondered why I had not sent him an announcement. I was so uncomfortable. I took a deep breath, my face flushed and my heart pounding, and said: "Rabbi, my contract includes playing on Friday and Saturday nights." As always, his sensitivity to his fellow human beings howed itself as he said, "Warren, you will get there, just take one step

at a time." The room stopped moving, and I felt a surge of relief.

He and his wife Aidel came to hear me at the Essex House one evening. As with so many performers, I have a tendency to physically embrace those people who come to hear and see me. I guess it's just our way of showing appreciation. What I didn't realize at the time

was that Orthodox women do not touch men other than their husbands. When they left that evening, I noticed that the rabbi's wife's hands were modestly at her sides.

Needless to say, one of my selections that evening included my arrangement of "Edelweiss" from Sound of Music, in honor of "Aidel."

My next engagement, after several years at the Essex House, was at the Rainbow Room. Yes, the Buchwald family did get an announcement this time, and I no

longer accept performing engagements on Friday nights.

Beginner's Orthodox Service

Rabbi Buchwald's weekly Beginner's Service—part of the National Jewish Outreach Program, at the Lincoln Square Synagogue (200 Amsterdam Ave., at 69th St.; 874-6100)—is not your typical Sabbath quorum. The three-hour service shifts easily from silent recitation of the Shabbat Amidah's blessings ("the attempt to communicate on the most sublime level with the divine") to gossip about local machers. A lesson in Jewish bowing becomes a diatribe about West Bank politics. Even the mechitzah-a white curtain hung down the middle of the room to separate the sexes-doesn't discourage a small-scale gender war: "At 2:30 in the morning, they should walk you home anyway!" demands a woman, referring to the Orthodox law that says unmarried men and women can't be alone together. From across the room comes a counterpoint: "Why shouldn't a woman be sensible enough to prearrange an escort?" Before the rabbi has to break things up, someone offers an observance that has the group whooping with laughter: "What is this? Geraldo?'
