**PASSOVER** Ariela Cohen

For as long as I can remember, if someone were to ask me what my favorite holiday was, I would have always answered - Passover, of course.

I loved the whole ritual and ceremonial nature of it, going to our storage unit and taking out all the dishes we only ever used for Passover, cleaning every corner of the house, zip-tying shut the drawers and cabinets in the kitchen so we wouldn't accidently use a non-kosher-for-Passover dish or fork.

I grew up in a home that always hosted large seders, and I loved in our Aleph uniform (reserved for ceremonies and for when

it. I loved preparing for so many people that we had to turn carboard boxes into tables for the kids, making sure everything was pretty and put together perfectly. I loved looking at the pictures in the Haggadah and fighting over who got to read what line, and later falling asleep on the couch while the adults kept going.

But, I think that the most powerful memory I have is something my mom insisted we do

every seder. In our Haggadah there was a list of all the tragedies that the Jewish people endured--every place we have been kicked out of, murdered in, been accused of murder, been exiled, and every atrocity that has been committed against us up until now.

The house would get silent, adults and children, sitting and listening as we remembered and honored our relatives and ancestors who survived, and those that didn't. I think that this, more than anything else, turned me into a committed Zionist. When you spend two hours listening to the very long list of homes we've lost (every single one), it becomes an inarguable fact that without our own country, in our Promised Land, the Jewish people will be doomed to continue adding to the list.

When I moved to Israel, my first experience of Passover and a seder was in the army. Some things were the same, but some were different.

First up, cleaning--boy did we clean! We cleaned, and then a really

mean officer with a white glove came, swiped some obscure corner of some window, yelled at us that everything was dirty, and then we cleaned some more. Rinse and repeat.

After cleaning for days, (I kid you not, we cleaned for at least a week leading up to Passover), the night of the seder finally arrived. (Notice I said seder and not "seders," because in Israel we only have one--something I forget over and over again).

The whole base (all 3,000 soldiers) showered and got dressed

leaving base). Together we sat down in our enormous dining hall and the base's Rabbi led what was essentially thousands of children through a seder.

looked around, remembered all those seders I had sat at all those years at home saying, "Next year in Jerusalem," and I remembered the memorial list.

And look at me now! Granted I was on an army base in the middle

of the desert, 45 minutes from Eilat and not Jerusalem--but that's just "semantics." I had done it! I had made it to our "home," our real home, and I was determined to do everything I could to make sure that our home would still be standing for all those who would later decide to come, either by choice or lack thereof.

I think my family is proud of me, the little girl who helped tape up the kitchen counters and set the table for the guests. Who always read the line of the smart child.

In Israel you are not a guest, in Eretz Yisrael you are home, and from your home you can never be exiled. Outside of Israel you have a home, in Israel you are home. "L'Shana Haba'ah b'Yerushalayim." Next Year in Jerusalem!
