### **Dvar Torah**

This week's parsha is called Eikev, which in Hebrew translates to "the heel of your foot" but in the context of the Torah it means the word "because." The words in the parsha say "because you will keep these mitzvot, Hashem will give you all of these brachot." Rashi asks, why is the word eikev used in this way when it normally means heel? Rashi answers his own question, explaining that when a person keeps the mitzvot, even the ones that are easily "stepped over" he/she will be rewarded with many brachot and blessings. An example of this is the importance of saying both Birkat Hamazon when we wash for bread (which is a mitzvah we do often) and making a bracha prior to eating food. It's easy for the little bracha here and there to slip by us. Eikev reminds us of the importance of every single mitzvah, and never "stepping over" the little guy.

- 3. Why does Rashi say the word Eikev is used?
