Kinderblock 66: Return to Buchenwald: 2:30pm and 5:30pm

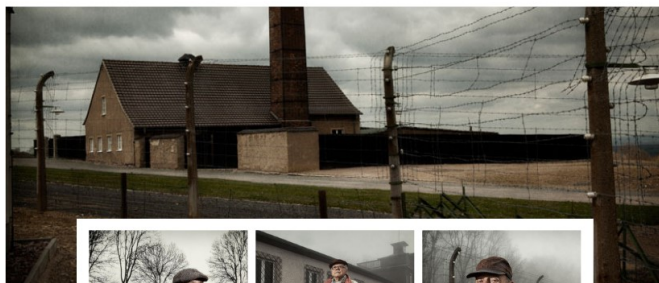

Dvar Torah

There are three types of laws in Judaism: *Mishpatim* (totally logical laws), *Aidut* (testimonials), and *Chukim* (mystical laws with no rational explanation.) In this week's *Parshat Chukat*, we read about the *Parah Adumah* (Red Heifer), a classic example of one of the *Chukim* -- it is completely mystical and doesn't make logical sense. If someone was *Tameh* (impure), they were sprinkled with the ashes of the *Parah Adumah* and became pure. However, if one was accidentally sprinkled with the ashes (when they were already pure), they would become *Tameh*.

Parshat Chukat starts with "These are the laws of the Torah" before it delves into the details of the *Parah Adumah*. But shouldn't it have said "Here are the laws of the *Parah Adumah*?" This teaches us that all the laws we have are *Chukim* -- even the *mitzvot* that we think we understand, there's actually more to them than meets the eye. We should never be fooled into thinking, "I understand this *mitzvah* so I'll keep it, but I don't understand this *mitzvah*, so I won't keep it." Rather we should keep all the *mitzvot* and laws because they are all the laws of *Hashem*.

2. Which example of a *Chok* is discussed in this week's *Parsha*?
3. Why is it important for us to keep *mitzvot* even if we don't understand why?

Answers:
1. Laws
2. *Parah Adumah*
3. Because all *mitzvot* are from *Hashem*
