Dvar Torah

This week we begin a new book of the Torah, *Sefer Devarim*. In addition to *Devarim*, we also refer to this Shabbat with a special name, *Shabbat Chazon*, because we read about Yeshaya's vision in the *Haftarah*, the first word of which is "*Chazon*." The Rebbe of Barditchiv explained a deeper connection for the naming *Parshat Chazon*. *Chazon* literally means prophecy or vision, and the Rebbe of Berditchev said that on this Shabbat, while we sleep on Friday night, every single Jewish person in the world will experience a *Chazon* or vision of the rebuilding of the third *Beit Hamikdash*. We may or may not remember it when we wake up, but every single person will have that experience. As we approach *Tisha B'Av* this Sunday, and we remember the destruction of the *Beit Hamikdash*, may we all focus a little more intently on the rebuilding of the *Beit Hamikdash* in Jerusalem and the coming of *Moshiach*, speedily in our days.

After Shul, Ask Your Children:

1. Which new *sefer* begins this Shabbat?
2. Why is this week called *Shabbat Chazon*?
3. How did the Rebbe of Berditchev explain Shabbat Chazon?

Answers:
1. Devarim
2. Because we read about Yeshaya's prophecy in this week's Haftarah
3. The Rebbe of Berditchev explained that on this Shabbat, while we sleep, every single Jewish person in the world experiences a *Chazon* or vision of the rebuilding of the *Beit Hamikdash*.
