# Sefer Devarim - Shabbat Chazon

This Shabbat, we begin the fifth book of the Torah, the book of *Devarim, Deuteronomy*. *In Devarim,* before he dies, Moshe rebukes the Jewish people by recounting the experiences which are already mentioned in the first four books of the Torah, such as the spies coming back with a negative report about the land of Israel.

This Shabbat is also known as Shabbat Chazon because the Haftorah begins with the words 'Chazon Yeshayahu,' the vision of Yeshaya the prophet. Reb Levi Yitzchak of Berditchev gave another reason; he said that this Shabbat, every Jew is shown a vision of the Beit Hamikdash Haslishi, the third Temple, that will be built in the days of Moshiach. We are shown this vision while we sleep on Friday night. Although we may not recall the vision when we wake up on Shabbat morning, nevertheless, the fact that we've been shown this vision is a positive thing. May we see the building of the third Beit Hamikdash with the coming of Moshiach speedily in our days.
