### Shabbat Theme: G-d Protects the Jewish People

This Shabbat our children will learn:

Who is the Parsha named after? Why did the Moavim elect Balak? What is Bilam's mission?  
How did Bilam travel from Aram to Moav? Which reference from 'Shrek' is in Parshat Balak?



### Parsha in a Nutshell:

Last week's Parsha, Chukas, ends with Bnei Yisrael's victories against Sichon (King of Amorites) and Og (King of Bashan). In this week's Parsha, Balak, the newly named King of Moav is elected to defeat Bnei Yisrael. King Balak feared Bnei Yisrael because of their wins against Sichon and Og who both had larger armies than the moabites. Balak hires a powerful magician, Bilam, who lived in Aram, to use magic to curse Bnei Yisrael but Hashem transforms the curses into blessings three times.

Rashi teaches us that Bilam knew the exact moment when Hashem was angry so he was able to take advantage of that. Bilam possessed an Ayin Hara (evil eye). On the third attempt to curse Bnei Yisrael, Bilam says "Mah Tovu" (how good are you) for the modesty that Bnei Yisrael show through their camp set-up.

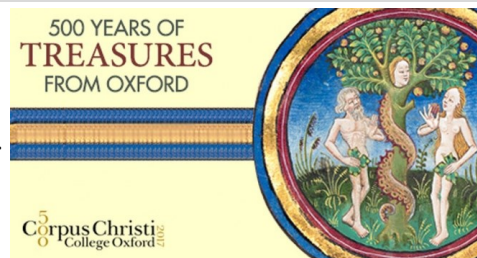

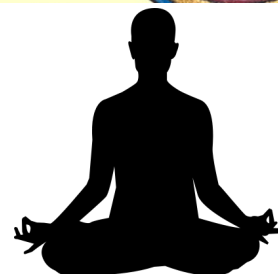
### Sunday July 16 • LSS Museum Tour • 11:00am
