Shabbat Theme: Peace and Patience

This Shabbat our children will learn... Which miracle was attributed to Miriam in the Desert? Who was Aharon and what were his virtues? How did Hashem react when Moshe hit the rock?



Mishna in Avot: "Hillel says: Be one of the disciples of Aharon. He loved peace and pursued peace; loved people and drew them close to the Torah" (Avot 1:12).

Parsha Nutshell: Chukat take place in year 38-40, traveling in the desert. Miriam passes away and the *Bear Miriam* dries up. Bnei Yisrael gets thirsty and Moshe hits the rock to provide water as he had previously done in Shemot- Parshat Beshalach, however, Moshe had been instructed to speak to the rock, not to hit it, and consequently, he is not the one to lead Bnei Yisrael into the land of Israel.
