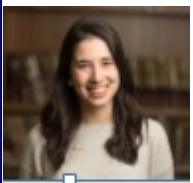

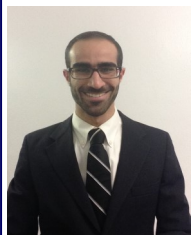
Meet our new Rabbinic and Community Interns
