Shabbat Theme:

Practice makes Perfect

This week's Parsha, Vaetchanan is the second in the book of Devarim and continues Moshe's review. The entire Sefer Devarim is called 'Mishna Torah,' a repetition of the Torah because the whole Sefer reviews the laws of the previous four books. In Vaetchanan we learn about the 10 Commandments and the first paragraph of Shema. This Shabbat is called Shabbat Nachamu, the first in a series of seven special Haftarot. The Haftorah begins with "Nachamu Nachamu Ami," the word "Nachamu" appears twice, representing comfort once for the first Beit Hamikdash and comfort twice for the 2nd Beit Hamikdash. Thankfully, the 9 days are finished and with Hashem's help, this time next year should be a Yom Tov, celebrating the coming of Mashiach in Israel.

This Shabbat our children will discuss: What is the other name for Sefer Devarim? Which everyday prayer is found in this week's Parsha? What is the other name for this week's Parsha? Why does the Haftorah begin with "Nachamu Nachamu Ami?" Who is speaking in this week's Parsha and throughout the book of Devarim?
