**Double Parsha** *Vayakhel-Pekudei*

**Parsha Theme** Repetition makes Perfection

### Dvar Torah written by Mendel Lazaros

This week's double portion of *Parshiot Vayakhel-Pekudei* finishes the second book of the Torah, *Sefer Shemot*. *Vayakhel-Pekudei* are a complete repetition of *Parshiot Terumah-Tetzaveh*, which we read two weeks ago. Just like *Terumah*, *Vayakhel* discusses the parts and dimensions of the Mishkan and just like *Tetzaveh*, *Pekudei* details garments of the *Cohen Gadol*. These *parshiot* are almost identical. This week, the Torah could have written one sentence for *Vayakhel-Pekudei*: The Jewish people did as G-d commanded them previously. Why then, the *Meforshim* ask, do we repeat all these details? The answer is that we are discussing the *Mishkan*, G-d's home; therefore, it is necessary to repeat everything to ensure that we get every detail correct regarding the structure and the responsibilities related to it.

1. Which *Parshiot* are identical to *Vayakhel-Pekudei*?
2. Who donated olive oil for the Menorah, the Anointing, and the *Ketoret*?
3. How many *Melachot* does the Talmud explain are forbidden on Shabbat?
4. When was the construction of the *Mishkan* completed?
5. What were the two 'rooms' of the *Mishkan* called?
6. What did the cloud near the *Mishkan* symbolize, and how has the cloud impacted today's technology landscape?

Parshat Vayakhel

Vayakhel introduces us for the second time to Bezalel, the chief architect and builder of the Mishkan. “And Moses said to the Israelites, ‘See, the Lord has singled out by name, Bezalel, the son of Uri, the son of Hur, of the tribe of Judah. He had endowed him with a divine spirit of skill, ability and knowledge in every kind of craft, and has inspired him to make designs for works in gold, silver, and copper, to cut stones for settings and to carve wood – to work in every kind of designer’s craft – and to give directions.’” (Exodus 35:30-34)

Of particular interest to us is the manner in which God announces Bezalel’s appointment. In our first encounter with this creative genius, the Torah employs the same awkward and puzzling wording. “Re’eh karati veshaym Betzalel, which translates literally as “See, I have singled out by name, Bezalel.” (Exodus 31:2)

Moses could have made a straightforward announcement, but the Torah utilizes a peculiar phrasing for an introduction in both places. The awkwardness of this wording is a red flag to our traditional commentators who pick up on the same point.

Rashi advocates that this strange statement in the Torah means no more than “I have designated Bezalel for this task.” Midrash Rabbah, which predates Rashi, gives an explanation that complements his straightforward interpretation. The Midrash relates that when Moses was on Mount Sinai to receive the Torah, God showed Moses the Book of Life, containing the names of every Jew in every generation from Creation until the ultimate Redemption. At that time God says to Moses “I have predetermined the creation of all people, and this includes Bezalel, who will construct the Mishkan.”

Midrash Rabbah avows that God created everyone before the world itself was actually complete and that our leaders occupy a prominent place in this divine blueprint. Thus, Bezalel had been named by God before time started because he possessed a unique role in the wilderness.

By contrast, we find a source in the Zohar which arrives at a completely opposite conclusion! The Zohar asserts that Bezalel, whose name literally translates as “in the shadow of God,” is not a surname he received at the beginning of time, but rather it is an honorific title that he achieved by fulfilling his divinely mandated duties. Applying the Zohar’s explanation to the introduction of Bezalel, we would read the verse as “Behold, I have designated that the name of the person to work in this holy endeavor should strive to be called Bezalel, in the shadow of God.”

In describing Bezalel’s responsibilities, the Torah includes another role in addition to that of architect and craftsman. In Exodus 35:34 we are told that “U-lehorot natan be’leebo,” which can be interpreted as “and the ability to teach was bestowed upon him.” With everything else on Bezalel’s agenda, we wonder what role teaching plays for him?

The majority of our traditional commentators assert that Hashem grants Bezalel with educational skills because the Israelites, who had been slaves for generations, did not possess the necessary skills to construct the Mishkan. Therefore, part of Bezalel’s job description included teaching others his trade.

Bezalel’s appointment teaches us something fundamental about the management of the construction of the Mishkan at one time, as well about leadership development for all times. In any profession or organization, leadership status requires that one be aware of the details, as well as the greater picture. Leadership begets responsibility and great attention to our words and actions. To be a leader also means living up to one’s name and earning the respect of others. Most importantly, to be a leader, one must see himself or herself as a teacher.

Ecclesiastes teaches us that “Whatever comes into being, the name was given long ago” (6:10). Similar to what we learned about the predestined course of Bezalel to become a leader, each human being is given a name and a unique purpose in the world. It is our challenge to tap into the wealth of potential inside each of us and to capitalize on it to achieve, or earn, our names.

While Bezalel merited living up to his name by working in “the shadow of God,” his true mission was to teach others how to find the shelter of God’s presence in their lives. As we strive to reach our potential and live up to our names as Jews and as human beings, we too enter into the shadow of God.
