## **Dvar Torah:**

Last week's Parsha ended when the Egyptian army found Yosef's silver goblet in Binyamin's saddle bag and Yosef declared that Binyamin will be imprisoned for his crime. This week's Parshat Vaygiash begins when Yehuda approaches Yosef and asks that he please not arrest Binyamin as he's the youngest child of their elder father and it would break his heart, so instead to arrest him. Yehuda pleads his case that he is older, stronger, more experienced, and will add more value. Yosef starts to get emotional and can no longer keep up the act . Yosef sends his guards away while he reveals his true identity and tells the brothers, do not be afraid, this was part of Hashem's plan because now he is in a position to help the family, Yosef tells them to bring their father because there are five more years of famine coming. The brothers returned to Kannan, but were afraid to tell Yakov the news because Yakov was now 130 years old and for the last 22 years, had thought Yosef was dead. They didn't want to put him into shock.

Serach, the daughter of Asher played the harp. The brothers asked their niece to play a calming song on the harp and sing the lyrics, "Yosef is alive." When Yakov overheard this song, he approached Serach to ask what this silly song was. Serach then told Yakov that Yosef is really alive and is the ruler of the Egypt. The brothers then confirmed and that night, Hashem appeared to Yakov in a dream and told him don't be afraid, he should go down to Egypt.

Parshat Vayigash December 14-15

## The Search for Our Brothers

The moment of truth has arrived. With Benjamin framed for stealing, and sentenced to enslavement, Joseph waits to see how Jacob's other sons will respond. Joseph believes that his well-orchestrated ruse will finally expose his brother's true colors. In the end, the significance of what Joseph learns surpasses even his wildest dreams.

This week's parshah opens with Judah appealing to the Egyptian viceroy, Joseph, his brother, to free Benjamin and to enslave Judah in his place. Judah's eloquent petition recounts his brothers' interaction with this Egyptian official as well as the familial circumstances of Jacob's household. Benjamin, the youngest son in the family, occupies a valued place in their father's eyes, because he is the last living remnant of Jacob's deceased wife, Rachel. In conclusion, Judah asserts that if he were to return home to Canaan without Benjamin, he could not bear to see his father's immediate and long-term pain and suffering.

Judah's words arouse Joseph's soul, so much so that Joseph makes himself known to his brothers. Witnessing Joseph's intense reaction to Judah's appeal, what does Judah say or do that compels Joseph to reveal himself at this moment?

As soon as Joseph "unmasks" himself, he urges his brothers not to be upset about their selling him into slavery many years before. He believes fervently that God's preordained plan for him involves maintaining life for Jacob's family and the civilized world.

As Jacob's family settles in Egypt, the first act of the covenantal epic of the children of Abraham comes to a close. With such an immense epiphany that his dreams are realized and that the future of his people seems certain, how could we expect Joseph to contain his emotions?!

The reoccurring Hebrew word for brother, "ach," in Genesis 45, suggests that Judah's passionate plea on behalf of Benjamin has significance beyond their own family's story. Joseph hears Judah's words on a deeper level and in a larger context that affects all the children of Adam and Eve.

Sustaining brotherhood represents humanity's first ongoing challenge upon being expelled from Eden. After slaughtering his brother, Cain utters the timeless question, "Hashomer achi anochi," "Am I my brother's keeper?" The overarching challenge of being one's brother's keeper, however, persists throughout Genesis. Generation after generation fails to get along with one another as jealousy, competition and greed get in their way.

At the beginning of his amazing odyssey, Joseph ventures to talk to his brothers on his father's behalf. Having lost his way, Joseph speaks to a stranger, who asks Joseph what he wants. "I am seeking my brothers." (Genesis 37:16) What sounds like a straightforward request for his brothers' physical location constitutes, in actuality, a deep-seated desire to live in harmony with them. Joseph's words can also be understood as his personal quest to respond to the question Cain posed generations before him, as to how truly to be one's brother's keeper.

In our story today, Joseph is overwhelmed by Judah's compassion not only for his father, but also for his brother, Benjamin. Judah is willing to take the place of his brother so as not to contribute to his father's pain. Judah has learned from the loss of his own two sons what loss can do to one's soul. Aviva Zornberg expounds in *Genesis: The Beginning of Desire*: "Initiated into the fellowship of pain, Judah becomes capable of investing the whole force of his personhood into preventing its recurrence." With his compassion and courage, Judah demonstrates before Joseph's very eyes what it means to be a brother.

As Judah's *teshuvah* unfolds before his very eyes, Joseph loses control of his emotions because not only will his family be reunited, but also humanity has finally proven that it can shoulder the responsibility of brotherhood.

May our generation be blessed with the courage and compassion to actualize this prophetic dream when the world needs it most.
