YOUTH AND MAGEN AVRAHAM TEEN DEPARTMENT

Dvar Torah:

In this week's Parsha, Vayera, Hashem tells Moshe to go back to Pharaoh and demand that he let the Jewish people go. When Pharaoh asked for a sign, Aharon's staff turned into a snake, but Pharaoh's magicians were able to do the same thing with their staff. Aharon's staff swallowed the staff of the magicians, but still, Pharaoh was not impressed. That's when the real plagues began. First, all the water in Egypt turned to blood. Frogs went all over the place. But Pharaoh was still not impressed because his magicians were able to do the same things. With the third plague, lice, Pharaoh's magicians finally admitted, "This is the finger of God." Rashi says that the magicians realized that their witchcraft would not work on creatures as tiny as lice. Then came the fourth plague, wild animals, and the fifth, where all the cattle got sick. For the sixth, G-d told Moshe to throw a handful of soot from a furnace into the sky and suddenly, the Egyptians were covered with blisters and boils. Finally, it started to hail. Rashi says the hail was a double miracle as each piece was ice with a drop of fire within. Fire and ice never mix so this was totally supernatural.

DVAR TORAH

Parshat Vaera January 15-16 By: Amos Alter

In our Sedra, HaShem tells Moshe (Ex. 7:15), "Go to Pharaoh, behold he is going out to the Nile, and Nitzavta lekrato." The Gemara (Zev. 102a) records a difference of opinion regarding this verse between R. Yohanan and Resh Lakish as to how to understand these last words, which would govern what Moshe's attitude towards Pharaoh was supposed to be. According to R. Yohanan, HaShem said, Pharaoh is a king—act with respect accordingly. According to Rashi (id.), R. Yohanan understands Nitzavta Lekrato as meaning that Moshe should stand for Pharaoh in accordance with the latter's greatness. Resh Lakish, on the other hand, says those words mean Pharaoh is evil, and Moshe should be insolent to him. Rashi understands Resh Lakish as interpreting the words in question to mean that Moshe should stand against Pharaoh.

There is one other verse, which, as the Gemara explains it, supports R. Yohanan's view. In next week's Sedra, Moshe says to Pharaoh (Ex. 11:8), "And all these, your servants, will come and bow to me," when in fact it was Pharaoh himself who would do so (Ex. 12:31). R. Yannai (Zev. id.) saw this as an example of the awe one is supposed to have for royalty.

A number of other sources, however, support Resh Lakish's position of disrespect by Moshe and Aharon, not only of Pharaoh, but of his god, Pharaoh's alter ego, the Nile (see the Haftarah for VaEyra). To treat them in chronological order, for

the plague of dam (blood), Aharon literally smacks the Nile with his staff, in front of Pharaoh and his retinue (Ex. 7:20). This is a clear insult to the Nile and to Pharaoh. Interestingly enough, in order to

duplicate Aharon's result, Pharaoh's Court Magicians must duplicate his acts (id. v. 22), thus forcing them into the same show of disrespect.

At the beginning of next week's Sedra, after warning Pharaoh about the impending plague of locusts, it is said of Moshe (Ex. 10:6), "He turned and exited Pharaoh's presence." The proper protocol for leaving a king's presence, certainly then and even today, was to back out of the room. To turn one's back on him and walk out simply was not done. This was major insolence. Finally, at the end of Moshe's last audience with Pharaoh before the Plague of the First-Born, it is said of Moshe (Ex. 11:8), "He left Pharaoh's presence in great anger." While there was a difference of opinion in the Gemara (id.) as to how that was expressed, according to Resh Lakish, Moshe slapped Pharaoh before leaving.

Before taking Moshe as our model, certainly as understood by Resh Lakish, we should remember that Moshe knew that HaShem had his back. To the extent we lack that clarity, we should hesitate to use that model.
