Dear LSS Community,

I haven't been able to sleep for a week now - the attacks that the State of Israel is enduring hurt the soul of every human being, and it is impossible to rest after reading even a few of the testimonies.

The main thing that gave me strength was the incredible embrace of the community. As a Jew and an Israeli I felt enveloped, and the support was simply amazing. I have no doubt that the American embrace strengthens all Israelis and soldiers.

It's been (literally) a week that I haven't slept - my reserve battalion (like most combat soldiers in the IDF) has been called up and is now waiting in the north in the hope that it won't have to act but in readiness for anything that happens. There is so much to do, both in Israel and in America but now, as the State of Israel is fighting for its existence, and with Israel fighting for its future, I feel and know that I need to be in Israel, to contribute my small part in the coming weeks until the situation calms down.

Ever since the rumors started that I was returning to Israel, I feel the community's incredible support for me and the country in general, and it simply excites and strengthens me.

I will miss you and I hope and am sure that I will return soon to continue learning with you and to be part of this amazing community. Praying together with you for salvation and comfort soon.
