DVAR TORAH PARSHAT BO

There is an unusual order of events in this week's Parsha that I find fascinating.

The Torah reports that Hashem instructs Moses to commemorate Pesach (the "festival of matzot") even before the exodus takes place: "seven days shall you eat מצות (matzot), and on the first day you shall put away your γρη (hametz)." He gives these instructions twice more, lest Moshe fail to understand how important each detail is. Yet when the people get ready to leave it almost seems as if they have forgotten the instructions.

After the killing of the first born, when פרעה (Pharaoh) chases the Jewish people out of מצרים (Egypt), the Torah says, "And the people took their dough before it leavened and put it on their shoulders and they did according to the word of Moshe." It seems that the people had run out of time to leaven their dough. But how can that be?

The Jews already knew they would be liberated that night-- they were told to pack and to wear their garments for the journey. They had been told they would be eating מצה (matza) to commemorate their liberation, and they had been told not to have ממץ in their possession.

So why does the Torah indicate a lack of time to prepare, a surprise exit stage left? I believe it is making a psychological point.

Under normal conditions when we Jews go on a vacation we prepare well ahead of time. We book a donkey, pack our clothes, and take כשר (kosher) food. Here in מצרים (Egypt), even though we booked our airline tickets for our first mission to ישראל (Israel) and were fully packed, we had to understand and behave based on the knowledge that we were truly being freed by Hashem at the last moment. There is a duality here: "Go now, but what's the hurry?"

The issue of not really being prepared to leave is in fact what noo (Pesach) is all about. We depend on Hashem for our freedom, but we never take it for granted even though we were told it would come. We leave our haughtiness at the door of מצרים (Egypt).

Our freedom from persecution and even our existence on this earth hangs on a thin thread. It is only with the help of the Almighty that we are free. Had we not been freed from מצרים but had ceased to be slaves it would have been enough.

Every week, though we know שבת (Shabbat) is coming, our preparations are down to the wire, no matter how late in the day it comes. We have all of אלול (Elul) to prepare for the (The days of Awe), yet we are unprepared for it.

Every year we know that noo is coming, yet it still seems to sneak up on us. We are still cleaning until the last second, but we never really feel we have cleaned enough. We never feel really prepared in the exile. noo humbles us: if we felt confident, we wouldn't bother eating מצה. Pass the חלה dipped in honey.
