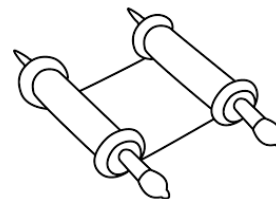

Ha'Azinu Dvar Torah

Dvar Torah Ha'azinu

This week's Torah portion, when viewed in conjunction with last week's parsha, provides us with insights on how to work with, train and teach others.

Yehoshua was chosen by God to replace Moshe – and to lead the Jewish people to the Promised Land. Moshe's dream from the day he had led the Israelites out of slavery and bondage in Egypt was to lead his People to the land that G-d had promised their ancestors would be theirs. And then, just as they were poised to enter their land, the episode with the "spies" put everything on a forty-year hold. As the forty-year period of wandering nears its end, G-d tells Moshe that he will not reach the promised land, and that Yehoshua will lead the Israelites there.

Moshe could have been angry and bitter and dealt with Yehoshua in that fashion. Instead, he does just the opposite. Moshe knew what he meant to the people. When he was late descending from Mount Sinai, the People despaired that he would not return, and they built the golden calf. He could not and would not allow a similar situation to develop when he died.

Accordingly, at the beginning of Vayelech, Moshe summons Yehoshua and **in front of all the people**, declares that Yehoshua will be their leader from now on (31:7-8). He tells Yehoshua to be strong and courageous for G-d will be with him as he conquers the land destined to belong to the Israelites. G-d and/or Moshe (or both, in tandem) give Yehoshua similar reinforcement using similar words towards the end of Vayelech (31:23).

Then Parshat Ha'azinu sets forth a song lasting 43 verses. When the song ends, the Torah tells us that Moshe **and Yehoshua** conveyed the song to the Children of Israel together (32: 44).

At the end of the day what Moshe has shown us is that the way to transfer leadership effectively is by providing positive reinforcement both publicly and privately to the new leader and by working together with the new leader in the public eye. As a result of Moshe's course of action, there is a seamless transfer of power from Moshe to Yehoshua.

I submit that positive reinforcement in public and in private along with working effectively with a student goes a long way to ensuring the success of a teacher-pupil relationship. I also believe that Moshe has shown how to behave in a way that will make any relationship thrive.
