The Power of Unity

When Haman proposes to Achashveirosh his extermination plan for the Jewish people, he says to him: "Yeshno am echad mefuzar u'meforad bein ha-amim." Sefaria translates: "There is a certain people, scattered and dispersed among the other peoples". Literally, Haman is telling Achashveirosh that the Jewish people are scattered throughout his empire. However, the commentators invoke a deeper message here. At the beginning of the Purim story, the Jewish people are not united. They are divided and dispersed. This is one of the reasons for the initial success of Haman. If the Jewish people are not united amongst themselves, our enemies can begin to rise.

Later in the Megillah, Esther asks Mordechai to gather the Jewish people and fast for the success of her mission. She states "Leich, k'nos et kol haYehudim,"— "Go and gather all of the Jews." On a deeper level, she is teaching that in order to overcome Haman's evil decrees, the Jewish people must be gathered together, they must be united. That is the key to overcoming our enemies.

And how do we celebrate Purim? After the threat has been removed and the holiday of Purim is established, two of the special mitzvot which we fulfill on Purim day are to bring foods to our friends (Mishloach Manot) and gifts to the poor (Matanot La'evyonim). These mitzvot promote unity and camaraderie among the Jewish people. They are the antidote to the disparity which was exhibited at the beginning of the Megillah. Once again, the message of Purim is clear: When we present a united front, G-d helps us to defeat our enemies.

In honor of my father Mr. Cyrus Abbe's 85th birthday, I'd like to share with you a lesson I have learned from him. My father taught that we must be concerned for the plight of our Jewish brethren no matter where in the world they may be. His work for Soviet and Romanian refuseniks, Syrian Jewish brides and Ethiopian Jews, to name a few, show his deep commitment to his fellow brothers and sisters. No Jew can be forgotten! We must do our best to help every single Jew!

As we once again face the threat of our enemies here in the Land of Israel, we must take this message of the Purim story deeply to heart. May we unite as one nation and herald in a time where G-d will see our unity and vanquish our enemies.
