DVAR TORAH PARSHAT TERUMAH

Dvar Torah – Parshat Trumah

This week's *parsha* contains the beginning of an extraordinary occurrence. G-d tells Moshe to speak to Bnei Yisrael and ask each person whose "heart is motivated" to give a portion of their property toward building a sanctuary where G-d's spirit can reside (Ch. 25, v.10).

Several *parshiot* and more than ten chapters later, we learn that the Jewish people (who were otherwise chronic complainers) had brought and donated more than was needed to construct the Tabernacle and had to be prevented from bringing and giving more (Parshat Vayakhel, Ch. 36, v. 3–7)!

Throughout the narrative, the Torah repeats the phrase that makes clear that the people acted because their "hearts motivated them" to give these gifts to G-d.

Compare and contrast this story with the one contained in the Haftorah from the first book of Kings, when Shlomo begins the construction of the *Beit Hamikdash*. His first act is to levy a tax upon all of Israel (Ch. 5, v. 27) which requires

significant labor to accomplish this project. The result of Shlomo's decision to levy a tax is a magnificent edifice dedicated to G-d by the Jewish people. The long-term effects of this decision, however, are disastrous. After Shlomo's forty-year reign ends with his passing, the Jewish people beseech his son, Rechavam, who has ascended to the throne, to lighten the load on the people that his father had imposed (Ch.12, v. 4). Rechavam does not respond to the peoples' request or heed the advice of the Elders; instead, he listens to his young advisers and refuses to ease the people's burden (Ch. 12, v. 14). As a result, political chicanery brings about the secession of ten tribes of Israel from Rechavam's kingdom.

Today's leaders face the same dilemma when initiating all sorts of projects: on the one hand, they want to do something big and impressive like building the Temple; on the other hand, they want everyone to feel a part of the project without undue burdening. May our leaders succeed in combining these two goals in all their projects.
