Amalek: Exactly who has to do what and when?

This week is Shabbat Zachor, which always precedes Purim.

The Torah reading concludes with a special passage from Parshat Ki Teitzei in Sefer Devorim and instructs us to "wipe out the memory of Amalek."

But, hey, wait a minute, in Parshat B'shalach in Sefer Shemot, Hashem tells Moshe, "Write this down as a remembrance....I shall surely erase the memory of Amalek from under the heavens," so why is Hashem telling us now that WE have to do it? Did He have a change of heart? 'Seems like G-d is passing the buck — what gives ?

Another question: On Purim day, we read the Amalek encounter from B'shalach. But shouldn't the order be reversed, meaning on Zachor, we should read the first encounter in B'shalach, and on Purim we should read the Amalek remembrance in Ki Teitzei — what is the rationale for doing it seemingly out of order?

The Talmud says that man must put forth the initial effort, and only after that, will G-d intervene to help out.

We see this at the splitting of the Sea: only after Nachshon entered the waters up to his neck, did Hashem then split the sea allowing B'nei Yisrael safe passage.

Perhaps the message regarding Amalek is along these same lines: We have to do our part, and then Hashem will do His. Man has Free Will and only we can determine what our Midot will be: whether we adhere to Torah, Avodah and Gemilat Chesed and we don't give in to the Yetzer Hara — or if, heaven forbid, we stray down the path of Amalek. It's a partnership, but we have to shoot first, and then Hashem will, pray G-d, defeat the Bad Guys...

So perhaps on Zachor, we read from Ki Teitzei to remind us of what we have to do —that we need to erase Amalek from our life — and then a few days later on Purim, we read from B'shalach to recall that Hashem is in this battle with us, and we remember the promise that He made.

'Wishing everyone a Joyous Purim which we can help bring about by fulfilling the mitzvot and opportunities that the day presents!

<div>NEXT SHABBAT</div>			<div>PEACE OF MIND</div>			<div> <div> <div>Every year, thousands of released Israeli combat soldiers face the difficult transition back to civilian life. Many spend months overseas as a means to discharge and mitigate the psychological impact of intense combat experiences faced during their military service. Despite the well-known image of the resilient Israeli soldier, long-term effects of veterans’ exposure to stress from combat are well documented. Veterans can suffer from a myriad of psychological difficulties ranging from difficulties in relationships, aggressiveness, sleep disturbances, substance abuse, and depression. Peace of Mind works with 15-20 IDF veterans from a high-risk combat unit who all served together. Led by two Metav (Israel Psychotrauma Center) therapists, the program consists of approximately 65 hours of group counseling held in a supportive diaspora community. The support and love from the community plays a vital role in the healing process for these soldiers and enables them to emerge with strengthened emotional and mental health allowing for a healthier transition from military to civilian life. The government of Israel recognizes the value of this program and for the first time has agreed to partially fund it. This year LSS will have the privilege of hosting a group of former combat soldiers from the elite Sayeret Maglan unit.</div> <div> <div>This unit operates behind enemy lines and is involved with counter terrorism and intelligence gathering. The program will take place at LSS from 6/11-6/18 and is extremely expensive to run despite the partial governmental funding. As such we must raise a large portion to enable the program to take place.</div> <div>We hope that everyone in our community contributes. We will also require lodging for these participants who will stay with host families in groups of two. Several of our community members have hosted this program previously in their summer communities. Please feel free to reach out to Michael Doppelt, Daniel Feder or Dov Schwartzben for more information. They are all extremely committed to P.O.M. and have witnessed firsthand the incredible results of this program and the bonds established between the community and these soldiers who have given so much for the security of Israel and the diaspora Jewish Communities.
