DVAR TORAH SHABBAT HAGADOL PARSHAT TZAV

Shabbat, March 31st-April 1st

Today is Shabbat Hagadol.

There are several suggestions made by our teachers as to why this is THE GREAT Shabbat: the Haftara, the taking of the pascal lamb in Egypt, the Rabbi giving a long talk about the upcoming holiday, and more.

But this year I have a special reason to call today Shabbat Hagadol. Today I am making a siyum for my having finished the seven-and-a-half-year cycle of Daf Yomi. Yes, this week I completed my seven-and-a-half-year study of the entire corpus of the Talmud Bavli. Every day, for the last seven and a half years, I did one Daf (both sides of one page), at times doubling up when I missed the previous day. Nearly all the studying was done at Lincoln Square Synagogue's early morning Daf Yomi program.

I just cannot believe that I accomplished this feat! Me?

Yes, I'd studied some Talmud in my earlier days, but to do the whole Shas!!!

I started soon after my mother's passing since I had to be in minyan anyhow and, Baruch Hashem, I continued. True, I am a retired ophthalmologist who now has the time. But even during the first few months of my study when I was still working, I was able to be in my Brooklyn office by nine since the shiurim are so early in the morning.

A couple of years ago, I was asked to teach the Daf Yomi shiur one day a week. The fact that I was asked was really an honor, but that I did it, sometimes well and sometimes just so-so, this just amazes me. I would usually awaken a couple of hours before the class to do a final prep (and wake up my wife Linda no matter how quiet I tried to be).

During Covid, we were all on Zoom. Now we are hybrid; most participants are present and some are on Zoom.

There has been a fair amount of criticism of this system of study; instead of spending hours and hours weaving through each portion, as is done in most Yeshivot, we do a page aday. How much can one learn and remember at such a fast pace? A lot! Maybe one doesn't remember the details of the Rabbinic debates, but certainly the ideas and concepts are remembered and serve as aids to ease with other studies. It's a real joy to sit in a Torah class and hear a teacher referring to a Talmudic dictum and you already

know it from studying the Daf!

You can sit in a million lectures about Torah, but Through her editing work, Gloria has gently none of them will approach what you will learn studying the text by yourself, not even close. Torah in the Shabbat Echod for several years

BUT we have problems! With me leaving the group, Fred Ehrman spending most of his days in Israel, and a couple of folks who just drifted away during Covid, our program is in danger of being discontinued and that would be such a pity. Our organizer and leader, Richard Wigler, does a great job of keeping everything in order but he is not a student head hunter.

Yes, of course you can do the Daf online, or go to other programs, but why not commit yourself to us for a month as a trial, either on Zoom, by phone or in person? You will find that our teachers, all laymen, are excellent; our attendees are good people, and you will be so proud and happy when you finish the sevenand-a-half-year cycle, as will your kids, grandkids, and even great-grandkids. Of course, women are encouraged to sit at the table with us and to join the very many women who now "do the Daf".

BUT TO WAKE UP SO EARLY??? In seven and a half years' time, you will be so glad that you missed some sleep, really glad, proud, wise, and filled with the mitzvah of learning Torah. Our schedule is printed in the Echod every week. TRY US and on a Shabbat lunch in seven and a half years you will be able to tell your grands:

"I LEARNED THE ENTIRE TALMUD BAVLI!" and that Shabbat will be a personal SHABBAT HAGADOL.

PEACE OF MIND

Every year, thousands of released Israeli combat soldiers face the difficult transition back to civilian life. Many spend months overseas as a means to discharge and mitigate the psychological impact of intense combat experiences faced during their military service.

Peace of Mind works with 15-20 IDF veterans from a high-risk combat unit who all served together. Led by two Metiv (Israel Psychotrauma Center) therapists, the program consists of approximately 65 hours of group counseling held in a supportive diaspora community. The support and love from the community plays a vital role in the healing process for these soldiers and enables them to emerge with strengthened emotional and mental health allowing for a healthier transition from military to civilian life.

This year LSS will have the privilege of hosting a group of former combat soldiers from the elite

Sayeret Maglan unit.

The program will take place at LSS from 6/11-6/18 and is extremely expensive to run.

We hope that everyone in our community contributes. We will also require lodging for these participants who will stay with host families in groups of two. Several of our community members have hosted this program previously in their summer communities.
