# Motzei Shabbat, January 20th: Resilience in Adversity: A Personal Account from Sderot on October 7th:

7:30pm: Join us as LSS welcomes Carmi Tint and Eyal Tarchitzky, members of Dror Israel, a grassroots educational organization. They reside in Dror's educators' community in Sderot, located less than two miles from the Gaza Strip. On October 7th, Carmi was alone with their then seven-month-old daughter for close to 48 hours in their safe room while Hamas terrorists brutally murdered residents outside their building. Currently, Carmi, Eyal, their daughter, along with other Dror Israel educators and thousands of Sderot residents, have been residing in a hotel by the Dead Sea for the past three months.

Carmi and Eyal will share their personal story and introduce us to Dror. Dror Israel has an extensive and successful track record in emergency response. Its educators have previously taken action to support traumatized children during past wars in Israel, the COVID lockdowns, and in response to the war in Ukraine. Now, facing this national tragedy, Dror Israel, in cooperation with local municipalities and the IDF Home Front Command, is providing support to tens of thousands of traumatized evacuees and has established programs to assist evacuees and residents in the hardest-hit communities.

# **DVAR TORAH PARSHAT VAERA**

The Seventh Chabad Rebbe, Rabbi Menachem Mendel Schneerson z"I, is memorable for many things. One of his less famous accomplishments is my favorite. He essentially created a new genre consisting of close and meticulous comparison of Rashi's comments on the Torah portion to Rashi's sources in the Midrash and Talmud. He generally finds apparent problems in Rashi's interpretation, resolves them, and adds an inspiring message to boot. This genre is one of three genres one finds in *Likutei Sichot*, a black-bound collection one can find on most Chabad Chassidim's bookshelves. (The other two genres are mystical discourses and similarly close readings of Rambam's legal rulings.) Rabbi Sacks z'l loved these "Rashi sichos" so much that he translated several into English and published them in book form.

One year Rabbi Schneerson focused on Rashi's comment on the boils plague in Parshat Va'era. The Torah reads, "G-d said to Moses and Aaron: 'Each of you take handfuls of soot from the kiln and let Moses throw it towards the sky in front of Pharaoh. It will become fine dust all over the land of Egypt and cause an inflammation breaking out in boils on human and beast throughout the land of Egypt." One of Rashi's comments on the first verse is "Since anything which is thrown with force must be thrown with one hand only, there were many miracles here. One, that Moses' closed fingers held as much dust as would fill both of his fists and both of Aaron's fists. One, that the dust spread itself throughout the whole of Egypt."

The Rebbe's commentary, as always, raises apparent difficulties with Rashi's phrasing and content. To list just two problems: Why does Rashi use the unusual phrasing "One... One" when listing the two miracles? It's kind of like me asking a friend, "Pick up many groceries from Trader Joe's for me. One, hummus. One, challah.." and then saying nothing more. Also, why exclude one of the miracles from his source in the Midrash and add the phrase "there were many miracles here?"

The Rebbe z'l resolves these and other problems by noting that the boils are uniquely brought about through actions simultaneously pairing the natural and the miraculous. For example, Moses holds the ash, but the quantity held is more than humanly possible. The ashes fly up into the air as one would expect, but they go far further than they would naturally, covering all of Egypt. Hot ashes can normally cause boils, but not ashes that have flown across an entire empire. The unusual phrasing "One... one" highlights that each miracle is paired with a natural occurrence, rather than elements in a list as would the more standard, "One... two..." The entire process of the boils plague shows G-d's ability to not just override nature but also to transform its normal workings.

I believe this pairing of nature and miracles still exists in our lives. In the *Modim* section of the silent *Amida* prayer we thank G-d for his "miracles that are with us every day." We don't generally perceive these daily occurrences, but they surely exist, woven so carefully into our regular perception of nature that our eyes skip over them, in a more subtle version of how the miraculous and mundane blended together with the plague of the boils. We should merit the eyes to see this daily flow of divine benevolence and the heart to extend our gratitude for them.
