Alan Kadish, M.D. is President of Touro University, the largest Jewish-sponsored educational institution in the United States. YOUTH DVAR TORAH

Parshat Bamidbar opens up with Hashem commanding Moshe to take a census of the Jewish people.

It makes sense to count the Jews when they left Mitzrayim, and it makes sense that He counted the Jews after the Eigel. Once we were taken out of Egypt and we emerged as a new nation united by Hashem and the experience of being freed from our bondage it, was important to know how many people there were in this new nation. When there were Jews who perished as a result of the Cheit Ha'Egel it was necessary to take a national census in order to know how many Jews died and how many were spared. So why was it necessary to count the Jews before Hashem would bestow upon them the Shechina?

Rashi comments (1:1) that Hashem counts the Jews out of his love for them. He counted them when they were taken out of Mitzrayim, He counted them after members of Klal Yisrael died after the Cheit Ha'egel in order to know how many Jews survived, and He counted them here, in Parshat Bamidbar before He bestowed his Shechina upon them through the Mishkan. The Shem MiShmuel explains that this wasn't just a counting, it was an empowering appointment. As the Shechina was about to be bestowed upon the nation, empowering them to reach higher levels of spirituality, each individual needed to understand their own value and potential.

DVAR TORAH

Parshat Bambidar By Shlomo Offer June 3-4, 2022

Ever since the writing of the Septuagint, the book of Bamidbar has been translated as "Numbers" from the rabbinic appelation "Sefer Hapekudot." Granted, it was done in reference to the events bracketed in time by the census Moshe performed just after Mount Sinai, and the census performed again 38 years later on the plains of Moav, before the People of Israel entered the land. Except for Joshua and Caleb, none of the men enumerated in the first count are still alive at the second. But calling it "Numbers" presents a misleading emphasis because the book is actually more about the complexity of names, roles, choices, conflicts and consequences than about the simplicity of a census number.

Moshe Rabbeinu counted the people and was praised; King David counted the people and was chastised. Because Moshe's count was accompanied by an exhaustive list of names and narratives, it served as an act of love for Hashem to count Bnei Yisrael. David's failing was that he sought a quantity, to revel in his power as leader. Numbers are soulless; names are qualitative and convey identity, character, and fate. The dryness of the census in reading parashat Bamidbar is compensated by the deep richness of narrative and emotional impact of Hosea's life and prophesy in its haftorah reading. Through the naming of his children, Hosea brings his prophesy to life.

What's in a name? Every Yom Hashoah and Yom HaZikaron in Israel it is customary to recite the poem L'Kol Ish Yesh Shem, "Every Person has a Name" by the beloved classic Israeli poet Zelda Mishkofski. In it, she exhaustively lists the names given a person by his parents, his luck, his efforts, his sins, his aspirations, his enemies, his love, his challenges, even his death. The poem is reminiscent of a Medrash Tanhuma in Vayakhel: Every time a man increases his mitzvot, he earns himself a new name. There are three names by which a person is called: one that his father and mother call him, one that his peers call him, and one that he has earned for himself. The best one is the one he earned for himself.

This midrash, as well as the haftorah in Hosea, is a message of hope that, no matter what our circumstances, and how far we have wandered, we can still renew ourselves, energized by knowledge of G-d's unwavering love and betrothal to His people.

Hosea lived and prophesied in the last years of Jeroboam II, a corrupt king of the northern tribes, and he spent his life forewarning Israel's demise at the hands of the Assyrians in 722 B.C.

The Navi uses the metaphor of Hosea's marriage to Gomer, a prostitute, to explain Hashem's loyalty and belief in the people of Israel, in spite of their disloyalty in an era where idol worship was rampant. And the names Hashem commanded for Hosea's children represent a lifelong commitment to his prophecy.

Hosea challenged God, asking why He does not abandon the Jews and take another nation as his chosen people. In response, Hashem commanded Hosea to marry Gomer, even though he knew she would not be faithful. They had three children, and Hashem instructed that they be named Yizreel, after the valley where so many Israelites were killed, but also meaning the re-sowing of Israel into the land after the Diaspora; Lo-Ruchama, meaning "Without Mercy"; and Lo-Ami, meaning "They are no longer My People." Then, Hashem ordered Hosea to send his family away, and he could not abandon them. Hosea then understood, viscerally, G-d's continuing love and longing for the people of Israel. This was not just a literary metaphor of a disloyal wife: Hosea was made to actually live out the prophesy in his life, so that he would speak from the heart. In our Haftorah, Hosea teaches that the Jewish people can turn things around and reclaim Hashem's love. Then the names of the children of Israel will change and become Ami, "My People," and Ruchama, "Worthy of Mercy." We can control our destiny by being faithful to Hashem.

The Haftorah ends with G-d's promise that we recite every day while putting on tefillin, that Israel will be betrothed to Him forever, in justice and in mercy, and in true fidelity, and we will know G-d. Motivated by this knowledge, we can keep the hope that we, as a people and as

individuals, can and will always be embraced by G-d. The prophet reassures us that whether or not we believe in G-d, G-d believes in us.
