YOUTH DVAR TORAH

By Romy Sanger

One of the many commandments given to us in this week's Parsha, Parshat Behar, is the commandment of not lending with interest. In Pesukim לה to we are commanded,

" וְבֶי־יָמִוּף אָחִיף וּמֵטָה יָדוֹ עִמֵּךְ וְהֶחֲזַ קּתָּ בּוֹ גֵּר וְתוֹשֶׁב וְחַי עִמֵּךְ. אַל־תִּקַח מֵאִתּוֹ בֵּשֶׁף וְתַרְבִּית וְיֵרָאתָ מֵאֱלֹקִיף וְחֵי אָחָיף עַמֵּךְ. אֶת־כַּסְפְּףָ לְא־תִתַּו לָוֹ בְּנֵשֶׁף וּבְמַרְבָּית לֹא־תִתַּו אַכְלֵך״

"If your brother becomes impoverished and his means falter in your proximity, you shall strengthen him — proselyte or resident — so that he can live with you. Do not take from him interest and increase; and you shall fear your G-d — and let your brother live with you. Do not give him your money for interest, and do not give your food for increase."

We are told that we need to help our fellow Jews without gaining for ourselves.

Strangely, in the very next pasuk G-d says, אֲנִי הּ, אֱלְּקוּבֶּׁם אֲשִׁר־הוֹצֵאתִי אֶתְבֶּח לֵבֶם לֵאלֹקִים", "וֹ מַאֲרָץ מִאָרָץ מִאָרָים לָתֶת לָבֶם אֶת־אָרֶץ בְּנַעוּן לְהְיוֹת לָבֶם לֵאלֹקִים". I am Hashem, your G-d, Who took you out of the land of Egypt, to give you the land of Canaan, to be G-d unto you."

Why do these Pasukim follow one another? What is the juxtaposition? Rabbi Mordechai Kamenetzky explains that when G-d took us out of Egypt, He gave us lots of riches from the Egyptian people and then even more after .קריעת ים סוף. G-d requested that when we took the money, we do not take advantage. We use the money for positivity and not greed and our own benefit.
