If you already have an absentee ballot, the deadline to postmark or hand-deliver your absentee ballot is August 23rd.

Shabbat, September 17th: Scholar in Residence with Rabbi Dr. Raphael Zarum, Dean of the London School of Jewish Studies (LSJS).

Rabbi Dr. Raphael Zarum was recently appointed as the Rabbi Sacks Chair of Modern Jewish Thought, established by the Zandan family. YOUTH DVAR TORAH

This week's parsha is called Eikev, which in Hebrew translates to "the heel of your foot" but in the context of the Torah it means the word "because." The words in the parsha say "because you will keep these mitzvot, Hashem will give you all of these brachot." Rashi asks, why is the word eikev used in this way when it normally means heel? Rashi answers his own question, explaining that when a person keeps the mitzvot, even the ones that are easily "stepped over" he/she will be rewarded with many brachot and blessings. An example of this is the importance of saying both Birkat Hamazon when we wash for bread and making a bracha prior to eating food. It's easy for the little bracha here and there to slip by us. Eikev reminds us of the importance of every single mitzvah, and never "stepping over" the Mitzvot.
