YOUTH DVAR TORAH

The Torah records the rewards that Pinchas received (a Covenant of Peace, Priesthood) as a result of his zealous action (slaying the prominent Zimri and Kazbi for their idolatrous licentious action). The Talmud discusses the halachic guidelines of individuals employing zealotry in combating sinful activity. On a conceptual level- when is zealotry commendable? When is it frowned upon?

Rav Zvi Yehuda Kook z'l, advances the following principle. When the actions are motivated by an intense connection to the Jewish People- for the welfare of the Jewish People- the zealotry is acceptable and praiseworthy. However, if the zealousy is not motivated by a desire to assist the Jewish People- merely to punish, to berate- it is not acceptable.

We see textual proof for this principle near the conclusion of Parshat Balak the Torah states "And Pinchas the son of Elazar the son of Aharon the Kohen saw and he rose FROM THE MIDST OF THE COMMUNITY- EIDAH- and he took a spear in his hand....and the plague was stopped from on top of BNAI YISRAEL" (Sefer Bamidbar 25:7,8). The action of Pinchas stemmed from his identity with, and concern for, the Jewish People.

Similarly in the beginning of Parshat Pinchas the Torah records how the action of Pinchas removed the anger from the Jewish People via his zealous act AMONGST THEM which prevented the annihilation of the Jewish People (verse 11). In verse 13 the Torah testifies that Pinchas and his descendants merit an eternal covent of Kehunna (priesthood) due to being zealous for G-d and facilitating atonement for the Jewish People. Thus zealotry performed within the framework of identity with, and concern for, the Jewish People is exemplary (of course this is contingent upon adherence to the halachic parameters in each and every case). This is not the case if the zealotry does not flow from pure intentions.
