YOUTH DVAR TORAH

A Dvar Torah from the Commentary of Rav Hirsch:

"And Moshe could not enter the Tent of Assembly- Ohel Mo'edbecause the cloud rested upon it and the Glory of Hashem filled the Tabernacle- Mishkan" (Sefer Shmot 40:35).

Subsequent to the construction of the Mishkan why was Moshe Rabbeinu prevented from entering the Mishkan? Why is an explicit invitation from Hashem necessary for him to access this holy site?

Rav Hirsch explains that after the Mishkan was built Moshe was absolutely distanced from it and returned to the antion. The Mishkan was NOT an individual project. Hashem allows His Glory to rest amongst the Jewish People.

Thus precisely at this exalted moment- when Hashem rested His Presence amongst the People- Moshe exited the Mishkan and returned to the People. When Hashem intends to inform Moshe of Mitzvot to convey to the Jewish People, He will invite Moshe to come to the Ohel Moed. This will strengthen the sanctity of the people as a whole. The dwelling of The Honor of Hashem demands fulfillment of the Mitzvot by the individual and from the community.

Heart to Heart

The construction of the Mishkan is overseen by Betzalel. In addition to managing the nuts and bolts, a noteworthy responsibility seems shoehorned into the lead architect's job description: "And Hashem also put into his heart the ability to teach" (Exodus 35:34). With all of the details necessary to actualize this massive structure, we may wonder what is the value of the foreman simultaneously serving as lead educator? This question indicates that there are multiple agendas in the blueprints of this divinely ordained project.

Training the Israelites must be the first priority, argues the Ramban, because these former slaves have no experience with this sort of intricate work. This 13th century sage writes: "Israel in Egypt had been crushed under the work in mortar and in bricks, and had acquired no knowledge of how to work with silver and gold, and the cutting of precious stones, and had never seen them at all." The Israelites may have served as the backbone of Pharoah's construction crews, but their tasks were limited in skill and precision. In the eyes of the Ramban, job training represents a pragmatic step in cultivating the Israelite workforce.

In the aftermath of the Golden Calf, it is vital that the Mishkan constitute not only a breathtaking locus of spirituality, but also a platform for nurturing and celebrating the people's spirit. Recognizing that some brilliant people find it challenging sharing their expertise with others, the 12th century commentator Ibn Ezra asserts that finding the appropriate leader for the job is of paramount importance. With so much on the line, Hashem does not take any chances and endows Betzalel with pedagogic abilities.

I believe that the reason for Betzalel's appointment is deeper than the many hardhats he must wear. To uncover the nexus between contractor and educator, we need to turn our attention to how the Torah describes the Israelites engaged in this project. The Torah reads: "And everyone whose heart inspired them came, and everyone whose heart moved them brought to Hashem their offering for the work of the Tent of Meeting and for all its service and for the sacral vestments" (Exodus 35:21). While this verse focuses on the people's desire to contribute either their resources or efforts to the Tabernacle, what stands out is the word "heart."

We may recall that when Hashem appoints Betzalel, the teaching imperative is to be rooted in his heart, thereby connecting his heart to theirs. This dynamic reminds us of the famous Talmudic saying that "Words that come from the heart penetrate the heart" (Berakhot 6b). With this in mind, Betzalel's role is as much about teaching as it is about reaching the people. In his book, The Courage to Teach, Parker Palmer emphasizes that "Relational trust is built on movements of the human heart such as empathy, commitment, compassion, patience, and the capacity to forgive."

Embedded into this craftsman's curriculum is a nation-building exercise, one heart at a time. Betzalel does more than construct the Mishkan, he teaches the Jewish people to trust in Hashem, trust one another, and trust themselves again. The Mishkan represents an open invitation for the Jewish people then and now to begin again and reminds us of the endless possibilities when we unite with common purpose.
