#### **Dvar Torah:**

This week we begin a new book of the Torah, Sefer Devarim. In addition to Devarim, we also refer to this Shabbat with a special name. Shabbat Hazon, because we read about Yeshaya's vision in the Haftorah, the first word of which is "Hazon." The Rebbe of Barditchiv explained a deeper connection for the naming Parshat Hazon. Hazon literally means prophecy or vision, and the Rebbe of Berditchev said that on this Shabbat, while we sleep on Friday night, every single Jewish person in the world will experience a Hazon or vision of the rebuilding of the third Beit Hamikdash. We may or may not remember it when we wake up, but every single person will have that experience. As we approach *Tisha* B'Av this Sunday, and we remember the destruction of the Beit Hamikdash, may we all focus a little more intently on the rebuilding of the Beit Hamikdash in Jerusalem and the coming of Moshiach, speedily in our days.
