## YOUTH DVAR TORAH

עֲשִׂיתָ עַל-שׁוּלְיָיו רִמְיָהוּ תִכְלֶלֶת וְאַרְגָּמָן וְתוֹלַעַת שָׁנִי עַל-שׁוּלְיָיו סָבִיב וּפְעֻמֵּי זָהָב בְּתוֹכָם סָבִיב

You shall make on its (mantle) hem pomegranates of turquoise, purple, and scarlet wool, on its hem all around, and gold bells between them, all around. (Ex. 28:33)

The Me'il worn by the *Kohen Gadol* had attached to its bottom hem 72 ornaments in the shape of pomegranates alternating with 72 golden bells. These bells tinkled to announce the Kohen Gadol's arrival in the Mishkan and his departure from it.

We learn from the fact that the Kohen Gadol's entry was announced by bells that a person should not enter his own home unexpectedly. This shows us the importance of being sensitive and respectful to other people.

Pirkei Avot 4:3 states that "Do not be scornful of any person." One must be careful not to insult people, verbally or otherwise. Even the most inferior person must be treated respectfully, regardless of whether you understand their issues or not.

The key to relationships is to try and place yourself in your friends' shoes and see things from his perspective. For example, when it's hot outside and your roommate insists on the window being closed at night, try to understand his concerns - catching a cold and waking up sick the next morning!

Being sensitive to others can sometimes raise their spirits and affect their lives in a big way. As the saying goes- "Although it's nice to be important, it's more important to be nice!"

1. How bright did the menorah burn?

1. The light of the menorah in the Beit Hamikdash miraculously radiated such a brilliant glow that the entire city of Yerushalayim was lit up.
2. The Kohanim were in charge of making sure the menorah always stays lit.
3. Moshe was commanded to cloth Aharon and his sons and anoint his sons as Kohanim and anoint Aharon as Kohen Gadol.
4. The new mizbeach was supposed to be placed in the Kodesh, next to the ark/aron.

## DVAR TORAH

Parshat Tetzaveh February 11-12

Midrash Rabbah says that Moshe asked G-d to which tribe the priestly duties would be assigned. G-d answered that it would be the tribe of Levy (Moshe and Aaron's tribe). Moshe naturally assumed that he and his sons would be assigned the priestly duties. However, early in the parsha, G-d explicitly states that this is not to be.

G-d commands Moshe: "Bring Aaron, your brother, and his sons with him, from among the Children of Israel, that they may minister to me in the priest's office" (Shemot, 28:1).

Moshe must have been disappointed that he and his sons were not going to receive the privilege of serving as Kohanim, making offerings in the Mishkan on behalf of the people. Astonishingly, the Torah's record shows that Moshe's response to this direction is — nothing!  
No expression of disappointment or jealousy, no "murmuring" against G-d or Aaron.

Then, G-d continues commanding Moshe: "And you shall make holy garments for Aaron your brother, for splendor and beauty. And you shall speak to all that are wise-hearted, whom I have filled with a spirit of wisdom, that they shall make Aaron's garments to sanctify him, that he may minister to me in the priest's office.... And they [the same wise-hearted garment-makers, per Rashi] shall take the gold, and the blue, and the purple and the scarlet yarn and the fine linen..." (Shemot, 28:2-3,5) to make the High Priest's garments. My own suggestion: To drive the point home to the Children of Israel that there is ultimately no lingering rivalry or bad feelings between Moshe and Aaron over the assignment of the special privilege of the priesthood, G-d commands Moshe, himself, to anoint Aaron and his sons for priestly duties.

Imagine! The Torah says that Moshe was the greatest of all Hebrew prophets (Devarim, 34:11), but he doesn't get a special wardrobe of "splendor and beauty" to raise the dignity of his office in his service for G-d and the Children of Israel. (Do you think talking with G-d or standing up to Pharaoh is easy?) Yet, Aaron and his sons are given that honor for what appears to be a less difficult?

The Netziv, Rabbi Naftali Tzvi Israel Berlin, comments that both Moshe and Aaron were leaders and prophets of the Children of Israel. But they were not identical. In fact, no two people are exactly alike in their G-d-given talents, personality, and the values gained from their life experiences. The contrast between Aaron and Moshe, their jobs, and the relevance G-d attaches to Aaron's wardrobe for his work, and the irrelevance of Moshe's wardrobe to his work begs the question: What is G-d telling us about achieving greatness, or being a leader?

G-d is showing us that there are two ways to define greatness. For some, like Moshe, their greatness is manifest in the public sphere. Moshe advocated on behalf of the Children of Israel to Pharaoh and to G-d. Moshe received the Tablets of the Ten Commandments (twice!) from G-d. Moshe instructed the people in most of G-d's commandments and established a system of courts to dispense justice and resolve disputes. Moshe directed the construction of the Mishkan, and led our people out of Egypt to the very edge of their goal, the Land of Israel. But that is not the only form that greatness takes.

One can also define greatness internally — achieving one's potential, even if that potential does not entail making news or major changes in the public sphere. The mission and life of Aaron and his sons was confined and focused on the Mishkan and the sacrifices, to bring atonement for the people, and ultimately to be teachers and role models for cultivating loving relationships among the people. That kind of leadership and greatness — internally-focused, often by example and demonstration — was needed just as much as Moshe's more outward-facing kind of leadership and greatness, in Moshe and Aaron's time, as well as today.
