

UPDATED COVID ATTENDANCE GUIDELINES

In view of the current high rates of coronavirus infection and hospitalizations, **NY City health officials now strongly recommend that all individuals wear medical-grade masks in public indoor settings citywide.** While wearing masks is optional at LSS services for adults and children, regardless of vaccination status, and indoor kiddushim and meals are not limited to vaccinated individuals, we strongly encourage all who feel more comfortable or more safe wearing masks to do so, and we ask that attendees be sensitive to the comfort and safety concerns of others at shul by respecting any social distancing or masking desires of others. In addition, we request that anyone who is sick or has recently been exposed to coronavirus stay home and get tested.

With low turnout expected for the end-of-August Primary, and with key pro-Israel candidates on the ballot, every vote counts! The deadline to register to vote is this Friday, July 29th. Please make sure to verify your voter registration and party affiliation by clicking on the link in the online Echod. If you are not yet registered, please to do so by July 29th. If you do not plan to vote in-person, either during Early Voting (August 13-21) or on Election Day (August 23rd), it is imperative that you request an absentee ballot prior to August 8th. Deadline to postmark or deliver your absentee ballot is 08/23/22.

Shabbat, September 17th: Scholar in Residence with Rabbi Dr. Raphael Zarum, Dean of the London School of Jewish Studies (LSJS).

Rabbi Dr. Raphael Zarum was recently appointed as the Rabbi Sacks Chair of Modern Jewish Thought, established by the Zandan family. YOUTH DVAR TORAH

Like last week, this Shabbat also has a name for the Haftorah, Shabbat Nachamu. The Haftorah of Nachamu is read every year on the Shabbat after Tisha B'Av. The Haftorah, which begins with the words Nachamu Nachamu Ami is a series of 7 Haftorahs that all have to do with the same thing; comforting the Jewish people over the destruction of the Beit Hamikdash.

Why say the words Nachamu Nachamu, translated as "Be comforted, be comforted" twice? Comfort once for destruction of the first Beit Hamikdash and comfort secondarily for the destruction of the second Beit Hamikdash. R Levi Yitzchak of Berdichev gives the analogy that a father said to a little boy, I'll make you a suit. A tailor came to the house and the father told the boy not to wear it for playing, only for davening and going to school. The child plays in the mud and gets the suit torn. The father calls back the tailor who makes the boy a second suit. The father warns the boy again, yet the boy trashes the second suit as well. The father calls the tailor a third time. This time, once the suit is finished, the father hangs it in a high place and tells the boy that he'll get to wear the suit when he proves he can be responsible. Similarly, Hashem has already prepared the third Beit Hamikdash. That's the comfort of Nachamu Nachamu Ami knowing the third Beit Hamikdash is already prepared and simply waiting for us to assume responsibility.
