## YOUTH DVAR TORAH

In this week's Parsha we read:

ואת כל חלבה יסיר כאשר הוסר חלב מעל זבח השלמים והקטיר הכהן המזבח לריח ניחח לה' וכפר עליו הכהן ונסלח לו  
 .."And the priest shall make atonement for him and he shall be forgiven."  
 (Vayikra 4:31)

In Talmud Sotah 32b we read that when a person brings a female baby goat as a Korban, it causes himself embarrassment. Why is this? Because everyone who sees this offering realizes that he is brining it to atone for his sins and this differs from the lamb korban (4:32) because that can be brought for any purpose.

Rav Naftali of Berlin comments on this Pasuk and clarifies that the Torah's wording specifically says, "he shall be forgiven" and does not add the words "for his sins," whereas in other times in this Parsha- it specifies for sins. The reason for this specific wording is because when a person brings the female goat they are accepting the embarrassment upon themselves of the sins that they committed, even though they can offer a lamb and spare themselves the embarrassment (because people will not know that the purpose of the Korban was). Therefore, the Pasuk says "he shall be forgiven," meaning that he will be forgiven for everything he has done wrong.

When a person feels embarrassed about what they've done wrong, they should feel positively about their embarrassment. It shows that the person, regardless the mistake they made, has their priorities in the right place. They understand what right and wrong is and genuinely want to get better in order to better their relationship with Hashem. So when a person feels good about the fact that they're embarrassed, it means that there is room to grow within that suffering.

3. There three examples of a sin that would require a Korban Chatat are:  
 a. Swearing falsely for a testimony b. Entering the Beit Hamikdash c. Failing to fulfill a vow
4. The two words are "V'Shinantam L'Vanecha" - 'and you shall teach your children'

Parshat Zachor Vayikra 2022

### The Mask

A little over two years ago, masks were for Purim. Now, they have become a normal part of many people's daily wardrobe. What can we make of all of this? Can these Covid masks have anything to do with Purim?

In Parshat Zachor, we read about the attack of Amalek against the Jewish people. In describing the attack, the Torah tells us, "asher karcha ba'derech," [that he happened upon you on the way] (Artscroll Stone Chumash, page 1067). Teachers of Jewish philosophy expound that the essence of the evil of Amalek is the claim that everything in life is happenstance or coincidence. We believe that everything happens through the hand of G-d, but Amalek says, "Don't think about it too much. It's just a coincidence."

So, what does this have to do with Purim?

Did you know that G-d's name is not mentioned once in the entire Megillat Esther which we read on Purim? It's not a mistake! The story of Purim is the quintessential hidden miracle! The sea doesn't split, nothing supernatural happens. Just ancient Persian politics take their course, a Jewish girl becomes a queen, and just happens to be in the right place at the right time to save her people!

We need to look deeper to understand the real miracle of Purim, to understand the hand of G-d orchestrating events behind the scenes to save His people. We need to understand that when G-d created the world, He hid Himself, so to speak, behind the mask of nature. If G-d were obvious, man would be forced to follow His commandments. In order to give mankind free choice, man must think, look behind the mask, and realize Who is really running the show. This is the message of Purim and the antithesis of Amalek, who sees the mask at face value, without bothering to look behind it.

Do you know why we wear costumes on Purim?

One answer is to highlight this message of the hidden miracle of Purim. We wear masks to show that behind the mask of nature and politics, G-d is orchestrating world events!

It's striking that in our modern world, with all of our advanced science and technology, people are still wearing masks. Covid-19 has wreaked havoc in many people's lives. People have experienced death, financial setbacks, and emotional illness. But let's look behind the mask. It's not just happenstance. In 2022, G-d is still running the world. It seems like we're still in the middle of the story. We don't understand the purpose of all of this. But we can be comforted to know that we are in G-d's hands. Hopefully, sometime soon, dawn will break, and we will understand the wisdom of G-d's masterplan.

May we be blessed to see and appreciate the hand of G-d in our personal and national lives. Purim Sameach!
