Parsha Theme: A Struggle for Power

Parshat Korach

In the first pasuk, the Parsha says that Korach, Datan, Aviram, and On Ben Pelet started a coo against Moshe and Aharon. After this statement, the name On Ben Peles is never mentioned again. What happened to On Ben Pelet? The Midrash says his wife saved him by intentionally giving him wine so he would fall asleep. As the story goes, she saved his life.

Korach's wife was a bit different. She antagonized Korach and accused Moshe of nepotism. She rationalized that Amram, Moshe's father was the oldest so Moshe should be king (highest position) and Aharon should be Cohen Kadol (second highest position), but Korach's father, Yitzor, was the second oldest so he should have the next highest position. The Parsha says many times Korach wanted to be a Kohen Gadol, but Rashi says that Korach was even jealous that Moshe appointed Elitzaphon Ben Uziel to be prince of Levi (third highest position) instead of Korach.

Parsha Questions:

Which tribe was Korach a part of?
Why did Korach feel he should be in a position of leadership?
What happened to the people who rebelled?

Bonus Questions:

What does it mean for the President to be impeached? What was the Arab Spring?

Parshat Korach June 15-16

Two Wives

Korach took his cronies aside. Datan and Aviram, and On, the son of Pelet. All were Rubanites who pitched their tents next to Korach's people. And there were 250 important men from all branches of the wilderness society.

"Everyone is holy," they said to Moses. "Why do you get to pick and choose who becomes a Kohen? Isn't everyone equal under the law?"

These rabble-rousers screamed for social justice. But *Korach* was really a self- centered narcissist. It wasn't social justice he wanted. It was *Korach* justice. He wanted the *Kohengadolship* for himself.

Datan and Aviram were the ones who told Pharaoh about Moses killing an Egyptian. They took the forbidden Manna on Shabbat. They accused Moshe of taking Bnei Yisroel out of Israel only to bury them. "This you call a land of milk and honey?" they said. The snarling, rabble-rousing brothers would join any crowd that tried to make Moshe's life miserable.

Eventually, God opened the Earth and sent the uprisers to Sheoul. They would never see Olam Haba.

But what about Pelet's boy? He was a *Korach* crony. Did he die with the rest? His name went unmentioned. It took a *gemara* in Sanhedrin to tell us what really happened.

On ben Pelet gave his loyalties to Korach, his neighbor, and came home to his common-sense wife. She knew that her husband wanted power, not justice. Cleverly, she used this analysis.

"Whether Korach wins or Moses wins - you won't be a leader but just a follower," she told him.

A whirlwind started to whisk away all possessions of the *Korach* crowd, from needles in their garment to bobby pins in their yarmulkes. She watched her husband's bed being whisked. She grabbed onto it and here's what she did.

First, she got *On* drunk and put him to sleep. Then she grabbed off her *tichel* or *sheitel* (the *gemara* didn't say how she kept her hair covered), exposed her natural hair and took a seat in front of her tent. Anyone who came to get *On* was shocked by this exposed woman and left. She saved him.

"Apologize to Moshe," she said after the plague was over. "Apologize!" "I can't." said the wimpy On.

"If you won't, I will!"

She went to Moses and Moses forgave.

Korach's wife related to her husband in exactly the opposite way. Instead of building him up, she put him down. She made fun of the way he looked after complying with Moshe's command to shave off all his hair. "Look at what he did to you!" she said. She used expletives in her talk.

"Moses is also bald," Korach protested.

" Anything to be king," she said.

The rebellion was *Korach's* attempt to regain the respect of his wife.

"Your father had four brothers," she would say, fanning the flames. "Moses got the kingship and Aharon got the KohenGadolship. Why did Moses pick his brother to be the Kohen Gadol and Uzziel's son to be the Prince of the Kehati group? It should have been you," she said as she pointed at him in the chest. "You were next in line," she said. "Why did he skip your father and go to your youngest uncle? Who is Moses to make up laws?" Korach agreed.

"And what's this nonsense about blue threads he told about at the end of last week's sedrah? If your followers all put on blue outfits on your followers - would they need techeles?"

Korach wanted to look good to his wife and used the argument. Two things we learn from this:

That a spouse, husband or wife, can have an unusual effect on the outcome of his or her partner.

That women covered their hair in the desert.
