Consequences of Falling Short

A nuclear agreement with Iran that fails to close off all Iranian pathways to a bomb will have devastating consequences for the region and shatter the nuclear nonproliferation regime. The United States should continue to employ diplomacy to reach an agreement that blocks Iran's nuclear quest, but should not accept a deal that falls short of American objectives. As President Obama and a bipartisan group of congressional leaders have said, "No deal is better than a bad deal." (Source: AIPAC)

The Quiet Before the Storm

As expected, the original deadline for the conclusion of the talks with Iran about their nuclear program has been extended to July 7. Unfortunately, everything that we have read so far indicates that the eventual agreement will be a very bad deal for Israel. Five former senior officials in the Obama administration wrote an <u>open letter</u> that the current negotiators are headed toward concessions that would weaken international inspection of Iran's facilities, back away from forcing Tehran to reveal its suspected past work on weapons, and allow Iranian research and development that would put it on a course to resuming intensive production of nuclear fuel as soon as the accord expires.

What Can YOU Do?

To start, if you are not already a member of <u>AIPAC</u>, please join now. Keep in mind that AIPAC's critical work takes place year-around, not just during the three day annual conference.
