LSS Security Message - Keeping LSS Safe.

What exits may I use to leave the shul building?

Q. May I use the back doors past the women's section that lead directly on to the Lincoln Towers driveway?

Q. I daven in the main shul. May I use the north exit door from the front of the women's section on the front bimah, to the left of where the shul president sits?

Q. I daven in the Beit Medrash on the second floor. May I take the back staircase (by the north service elevator) and exit on to Amsterdam Ave. - coming out right next to the West End Synagogue?

A. The answer to all questions is no, no and no.

At this time there is only one way to exit the shul. Please use the main entrance to exit the shul.

For security reasons we don't want any other exit doors open in case somebody outside those doors wants to come in - avoiding our security screening. We are sorry for the inconvenience but we need total control of who has access to our shul. Controlling access to our shul is one of the strongest protections we have from intruders who want to harm us.

Lesson Learned: Please enter and exit the shul only using the main entrance doors. No exceptions.

The juxtaposition of Behar and BeChukothai is interesting. In Behar we receive the outline of the blessings and the curses for keeping the commandments of the Sabbatical years namely Shmita and Yoval.

For helping those financially in trouble, for good treatment of slaves, we are not told of our blessing. G-d tells us you should do this because I am the L-rd thy G-d who took you out of the land Egypt. Reminding us if we forgot I could have left you in Egypt to rot. So I already gave you the blessings.

As we continue to read into BeChukothai we get 13 sentences telling us of our reward for being obedient and 46 sentences telling us of our punishment for disobedience. This could have been done in two sentences.

If you obey my commandments you will have everything.

If you disobey you will have everything ripped from your grasp.

Instead G-d gives us detail. In the rewards he promises to take care of us financially, to live securely in the land and to have confidence in all that we do. "You will have your fill of food and live securely in the land... I will grant peace in the land so that you will sleep without fear... I led you out from Egypt and led you forth with your heads held high"

But those curses, Oh those curses, endless sentences of rebuke all those excruciating details of G-d's wrath against us. What he will do to us for idol worship. Of not treating not only our fellow Jew, but all the inhabitants of the land.

These details actually give us a window into all the misdeeds that we have or will (G-d forbid) do. It is a way to understand how we can avoid sin and accept G-ds commandments. Even the most righteous among us has acknowledged that they have not been sin free.

So what is G-d's limit? What can he accept and not accept before he lets go of his anger?

My father has seen the worst in human beings running to Russia to escape death during WW II. We didn't even have the land to commit some of these sins that G-d speaks about. What did we do so differently during that time from what we are doing now?

We have been blessed since those days ended. We have the land and it belongs to us. Yet, we are also cursed. There are those who don't understand what that means. We have terrible illnesses that should have been eradicated from society. So we have much to learn. All peoples of this earth, then and only then will G-d's complete blessing be bestowed and all curses eradicated from the land.
