No Tomb for Moses

"It was there in the land of Moab that God's servant Moses died. He buried him in the valley in the land of Moab, near Beth-peor. No man knows the place that he was buried, even to this day."

This needs explaining, because in general Jews keep careful track of burials. Jews have always visited graves of their loved ones, and many travel far to pray at the graveside of sages and leaders.

We know where the avot and imahot are buried. Traditions exist for the shrines of prophets: many Iraqi Jews venerated a tomb of Ezekiel, and some Persian Jews still visit a tomb of Esther and Mordechai. In Eastern Europe and North Africa, pious Jews would pray at the tombs of rebbes and tzaddikim. In Israel, Jews make pilgrimages to the tombs of the Tannaim, the Rambam, and the Kabbalists.

But Moses, our greatest leader, the one whom God chose to save the Jews from annihilation and transmit the Torah, the only human being who ever saw God "face to face," is buried... somewhere in Moab.

One popular theory is that God wanted to forestall the danger that the grieving people of Israel would try to deify Moses. After all, they built and worshipped an idol when he left them for a mere 40 days. Maybe God wanted to help Israel put the past behind and turn forward to new leaders-- starting with Joshua. Rather than getting bogged down in Moab, building a pyramid over his grave in imitation of the Egyptian cult of the dead, they needed to get up and cross the Jordan.

Judaism remembers the past, but it is about the living and the future. We don't have cemeteries behind our shuls, nor do we bury prominent people within. We give the dead an honored burial place-- carefully separated from our homes. We remember our martyrs and our past teachers, but we always put our energies in building the next generation and the next chapter in our people's saga.
