L'chaiym! Ofer Yavetz recommends visiting wineries. His favorites are Tishbi and Amphorae. The <u>Tishbi Winery</u> is in Zichron Yakov. The founders of the winery were immigrants from Lithuania who, in 1882 were commissioned by Baron Edmund de Rothschild to plant and develop vineyards in the area. Today, you can tour the winery and taste the various wines it produces, dine in its fine restaurants and purchase gourmet chocolate.

The <u>Amphorae Winery</u> is located on the Makura Farm at the heart of Western Carmel region. This area is one of the most ancient wine production locations not only in Israel, but in the world. The name "Carmel" is probably a deviation from the name "Kerem-El," which in translation from Hebrew means "God's Vineyard." Guided winery tours at Amphorae describe the process of wine creation and explain the peculiarities of different grape varieties. And, of course, the tour offers wine tastings.
