Shabbat Theme:
Learning through Reflection

After last week's completion of Bamidbar, this week's Parsha begins the fifth and final book of the Torah, the book of Devarim. Moshe recounts what has happened to Bnei Yisrael thus far in the desert, including their battles and the mistakes they've made, and leaves them with advice on how to be a better people in Eretz Yisrael. Moshe then reviews the mitzvot of Hashem. The Parsha ends with Moshe's appointment of Yehoshua Ben Nun as the one to enter Eretz Yisrael as the new leader of Bnei Yisrael. This Shabbat is also called Shabbat Chazon because the Haftarah starts with Chazon Yeshayahu, the vision of Yeshaya.

This Shabbat our children will learn: Who will lead Bnei Yisrael into Eretz Yisrael? What is the other name for this week's Parsha? Which story of the *Meraglim* does Moshe recount? Why recount the events of the desert now? Where is this happening?

LSS provides groups for children between the ages of 2-12. Our staff work hard to provide a safe and meaningful experience while implementing Jewish programming. Please help us create a proper decorum for davening by not socializing in our youth rooms. We thank you in advance for your cooperation.
