Parshat Ha'Azinu

As this week's Parsha nears its conclusion, G-d directs Moshe to climb to the top of Mt. Nebo, look at the land of Canaan (Ch. 32, V.50), which he has been yearning to reach for at least forty years – and die (V. 51). The reason that Moshe is denied entry into Israel is stated as: "Because you [and Aaron] rose up against Me . . . because you did not sanctify Me amongst the Children of Israel" (V.51): Instead of speaking to the rock to extract water from it, Moshe struck it.

I wondered, somewhat cynically, whether the severity of the punishment was in response to Moshe's nearly perfect personality. For him to commit even the smallest sin was so out of character that it warranted the gravest penalty, but I did not find that answer satisfactory because it just seemed so very unfair.

Something Rabbi Robinson said recently provided a possible resolution to my unease. The Rabbi talked about how a seemingly insignificant act (or omission) could have far-reaching consequences, (which, he went on to explain is why we should always act correctly and with great care).

In Chapter 20 of the book of *Bamidbar*, after Miriam dies, the Jewish People find themselves without water and complain about the situation. The Almighty directs Moshe take his staff, (used previously to hit a rock and produce water,) gather the nation and, together with Aaron, "speak to the rock for all the people to see and the rock will give up its water for the people to drink." (V. 8) First of all, it seemed unfair for G-d to direct Moshe to take his staff because that put the tool that he would need to commit his misdeed readily available. And secondly, what was so bad about hitting the rock?

But with Rabbi Robinson's insightful analysis applied to this situation, an explanation sprang forth. G-d wanted Moshe to show the people that there might be two ways to resolve a problem and help them understand that they should carefully consider all options before acting impetuously. In other words, while striking something might have worked in the past, it was important to consider whether talking would be a better, and equally effective, method to achieve the same result. Thus, the staff was there to show that Moshe could have followed the same course of action – but chose a better way to proceed.

Unfortunately, Moshe did not act in the manner that he had been directed. He, himself, acted impulsively and struck the rock twice, thereby failing "to sanctify G-d amongst the Children of Israel." By hitting the rock, Moshe denied G-d the opportunity to teach the Children of Israel at least three very important lessons: one should think before one acts; that violence is not always the best, or the only way, to respond to a bad situation; and that if speaking to a rock could produce water, then speaking to G-d (prayer or other ways) should certainly produce positive results.

His lapse in judgment cost Moshe dearly – but that was probably because he had truly failed to teach his charges several very important lessons that the Almighty had assigned him to demonstrate to them.

May we all always act thoughtfully and properly in all of our dealings with one another and with all humankind.
