

Hamas leader calls for end to talks with Israel

October 11, 2013

The head of the political wing of Hamas, Khaled Meshal, called on the Palestinian Authority to cease peace negotiations with Israel immediately, claiming that continuing the talks would endanger the status of Jerusalem. Meshal was in Ankara this week, where he met with Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan to discuss Palestinian reconciliation efforts and regional issues. Also in Ankara, he spoke by video to a rally in Beirut saying only armed struggle against Israel could achieve the right of return and protect Jerusalem. Without mentioning the P.A. by name, he attacked P.A. President Mahmoud Abbas, for renewing talks with Israel. Alluding to Egypt or Syria, Meshal said every people has a right to fight for its freedom, but that conflicts within the Arab world should steer clear of bloodshed, ethnic strife and outside influence.
