Prohibitions

- · No eating, drinking, washing, anointing, wearing leather shoes, marital relations, or extending greetings.
- · No learning Torah, except for sections dealing with the destruction of the Temple; i.e. The Book of Eicha and the account of the destruction in Tractate Gittin (56a-58a).
- · No tallit and tefillin in the morning. We do, however, put them on at Mincha on Tisha B'Av afternoon.
- · No sitting on chair of normal height until Chatzot (1:02pm on Tuesday).
