HEART & SOUL

When Jacob finally gave into Judah's plea to release Binyomin into his custody, the first instruction Yaakov gave him was "Kechu Mizimrat Haaretz Biclaichem,". The use of the phrase Mizimrat is peculiar because the root of this word is zemer which means song. Accordingly, Rashi explains it as follows: 'Take from that which is most praiseworthy of the land, for everybody sings about it when it arrives in the world."

The verse then begins to enumerate some specific items that Judah should take along such as a bit of balsam, a bit of honey etc..

Rabbi Shaul Taub, the Modzhitzer Rebbe, wondered, does everybody really sing about a bit of balsam and a bit of honey? What's so special about that? He quotes the Ran who interprets this as meaning that Jacob wanted to send Joseph a song of Eretz Yisroel. According to Rav Shaul and his chasidic movement, music is viewed as the true essence of spirituality and the primary method to achieve avodah shebelev, 'worship of the heart". He and his father, Rav Yisroel, emphasized the centrality of music to prayer, worship and devotion. Rav Shaul observed that G-d is referred to as Bocher shira vezimrah ""He who chooses music and song "just as G-d is described as a Bocher B'Torah"He who chooses Torah – indicating that both music and Torah are chosen by G-d. Accordingly Jacob wished to send Yosef something uniquely spiritual which can be achieved through music.

Interestingly, based on this aforementioned verse, Rav Yisroel wrote a Chanukah essay which relates the notes of the musical scale to the eight nights of Chanukah. As we sing in in the Maoz Tzur poem after lighting the menorah "Benai binah, yimai shmonah, kovu shir urenanim, men of insight, eight days, established for song and jubilation," we are reminded Chanukah is a time for singing.

How fitting then, on this Rosh Chodesh Shabbat Chanukah when we have many reasons to sing, that we have the merit to hear our own beloved Chaz daven for us for the last time as the "official" Chazzan of Lincoln Square Synagogue. Although not a Modzhitzer Chasid, he might as well be one. It wasn't just his mellifluous voice, immense musical knowledge and outstanding nusach that inspired us over the years but it was knowing that whenever he davened for us it came from his heart and there was no doubt in our minds that his prayers were being heard up above. Chaz, we wish you and your family well and thanks for the melodies.
