Bruce Roter, a music professor at the College of St. Rose in Albany, is spearheading the construction of the Museum of Political Corruption in Albany, exposing our government's shortcomings for all to view. It will feature a Lobby of Lobbyists, a Tammany Lecture Hall, the Cozy Crony Café, and a 'How to Cook Your Books" cookbook. Perhaps there should be an exhibit displaying the unholy alliance that sometimes develops between politicians and construction contractors?

An Epidemic of Falsehood

Perhaps the museum should also include this year's presidential campaign. If a logician reviewed all the candidates' allegations and assertions, he would necessarily conclude that they could not all be true.

A Dwelling-Place for Truth

This week's Torah portion, Pikudei, goes out of its way to show that there were no Cost Overruns in the construction of the Mishkan, the portable sanctuary which traveled with the Israelites in the wilderness. The text quantifies the collection of "building materials" and specifies exactly how gold, silver and copper were used. Over 3,000 years ago, financial integrity with community funds became part of our spiritual tradition.

Keep Your Hands Out of the Till

During the period of the Second Temple, anyone entering areas where Sanctuary Funds were kept was not permitted to wear any article of clothing that might conceal money. He could therefore go about his business without being suspected of theft (Mishna Shekalim, 3, 2.) . A system was established insuring that no one person was in charge of handling Sanctuary funds (Shekalim, 5, 2.)

Your Personal "Bottom Line"

It would be easy to conclude that none of us can make a difference in a world of corruption. R. Eliyahu Dessler guides us to think otherwise.

Each of us has enough education and integrity not to engage in corrupt practices. On the other hand (speaking for myself,) we may not realize that some of our "financial behavior" needs correcting.

We are left, then, to struggle to make the right choice somewhere on the spectrum between right and wrong. My particular "point of choice involves questions like

"On those days when I feel just a little under the weather, may I call in sick?"

"What level of productivity am I expected to maintain?"

"Shall I just follow orders from the boss, or discuss ways in which I think funds could be better spent?"

Each person's "moral bottom line" involves making the right decision at his or her point of choice. Each time any one of us makes the right choice, we reclaim a little more territory for integrity and truth in this world.

May the One whose Name is Truth strengthen us, and re-establish his Pure Presence on earth for all to view.
