Thank you to Gloria Kestenbaum for recommending the Israel Children's Museum in Holon. This educational and cultural institution provides experiences far different from any other Israeli museum. Kids are encouraged to touch the displays, feel the materials and even be part of the exhibits. Exhibits include:

- **Dialogue in the Dark** provides visitors with an insight into the world of the blind. Equipped only with a cane, visitors go through the hall, experiencing the world in complete darkness. At the end of the visit, they gather for a conversation (still held in the dark), with their blind guide.
- Invitation to Silence: In this exhibition, one learns that you can hear through your eyes, and speak using your hands. Visitors discover a new way of communicating, through hand movements and body language.
