### Call Our Congressman

Congressman Nadler has not yet publically declared his position other than to say that "the situation requires careful analysis." Click <u>here</u> to read his most recent press release.

Please contact his office to express your views about the deal. <u>Congressman Jerrold Nadler</u> 212.367.7350 State your case succinctly and politely. Here are some points you might make:

- The proposed deal does not ensure "anytime, anywhere" short-notice inspections.
- The proposed deal does not clearly condition sanctions relief on full Iranian cooperation in satisfying International Energy Agency concerns over the possible military dimensions of Tehran's program
- The proposed deal lifts sanctions as soon as the agreement commences, rather than gradually as Iran demonstrates sustained adherence to the agreement.
- The proposed deal lifts key restrictions in as few as eight years.
- The proposed deal would disconnect and store centrifuges in an easily eversible manner, but it requires no dismantlement of centrifuges on any Iranian nuclear facility.
