#### The Women who Give Moshe Life

Bereishit is filled with women. But after Moshe's birth – with few exceptions – they largely disappear from the Biblical narrative. That may be because Bereishit is a family saga, while the remaining four books of the Torah are a national story, played out in the public arena.

Still, it is worth noting that it takes an entire nation of women so that Moshe can be born. The Israelite women are defiant, even in the face of bitter servitude. "But as they afflicted [the people], so did it become many, so did it burst forth" (1:12). Although Pharaoh ordered the killing of all the male infants, the midwives Shifra and Puah "feared God and did not do as the king of Egypt spoke to them" (1:17).

In Moshe's own birth, it is his mother who takes the lead: "The woman conceived and gave birth to a son. She saw that he was good and she hid him for three months. She could not hide him any longer... (2.2-3)."

Then, it is Moshe's sister who waits at the river bank to see what will happen to him; it is her quick thinking that brings Moshe back to his mother for a few more months of nursing. When Pharaoh's daughter sees the little basket, she takes pity and says, "This is one of the Hebrew boys" (2.6). She, too, takes a risk in sheltering an infant whom her father has ordered to be killed.

While we know Shifra and Puah's names, these three women – the mother, the sister and the surrogate – are not named here. "A man went from the House of Levi and took a daughter of Levi" (2:1). Moshe's mother is not named until there is an abbreviated genealogy, five chapters later: "Amram took his aunt Yocheved as a wife and she bore him Aharon and Moshe..." (6:20).

Sister Miriam is only known as the "sister who stationed herself at a distance." In summoning her mother to nurse Moshe, she is simply called the "almah," the young girl, again without a name. Neither is she listed in the genealogy with her brothers in chapter 6. We first learn Miriam's name when she leads the women in the Song of the Sea – here she is acting as a leader in her own right.

As for Pharaoh's daughter who raises Moshe to adulthood, she remains anonymous. After Moshe flees Egypt – he is afraid for his life after killing the Egyptian -- does she ever see him again, I wonder? Did she come to love him and then lose this son? Did she pine for him as Jacob pined for Joseph?

Why does the Chumash take such pains to hide their names as Moshe is born? Perhaps it is because these three women are private individuals, part of a domestic story – and a story that played out in countless homes during those slave years. Since Shifra and Puah did not do as Pharaoh demanded, were other mothers also trying to keep their sons alive?

If this supposition is correct, then perhaps Yocheved, Miriam and Pharaoh's daughter are meant to represent Everywoman and every woman might see herself in their stories. Like the many women who defiantly became pregnant and gave birth, they are the backstory. They are the women who quietly subverted Pharaoh's evil decree – ensuring that there would be life, not death. They are the mothers and the quarantors of the Jewish People.
