RAV STAV ON: NEUTRALIZED TERRORISTS

Last week, a controversy erupted in Israel over the killing of an Arab terrorist who had just minutes earlier stabbed two Israeli soldiers in Hebron. Another Israeli soldier who arrived on the scene *after* the terrorist was lying on the ground apparently already neutralized, shot him dead. While the matter is now under investigation, the words of Rav David Stav back in October 2015 when the terror campaign was just beginning seem especially relevant. Rav Stav, the chairman of the <u>Tzohar</u> association of national-religious rabbis, clarified that despite the justified anger at Israeli Arabs targeting Jews, "people who are not involved in murderous activities and those who no longer pose a danger must not be harmed."



"The blood boils when you see Israeli Arabs, young and old, who have been making their livelihood from Jews, murdering children, soldiers, women and men indiscriminately, without any gratitude," Stav said, adding that "it is precisely on these days that the strength and uniqueness of the Israeli society is put to the test.

"These days, when the boiling blood is mixed with civilian willingness and resourcefulness, it's important to maintain our moral superiority: To avoid harming a person who is uninvolved in murderous activity, and to avoid harming those who have already been neutralized and no longer pose a danger."

Rabbi Stav went on to explain: "They deserve to die, but that is not our way. Harming a terrorist who has been neutralized causes double damage: The collateral damage is when these images are distributed, and the main damage is harming our moral norms. We will not stoop down to our enemies' despicableness, and we will not contaminate ourselves with a moral breakdown. The rabbi concluded by saying that "it's encouraging to see how the people continue to live their lives courageously, and civilians showing amazing resourcefulness during terror attacks." Then Moses inquired (darash) about the goat of purification offering, and it had already been burned! (Leviticus 10:16)

The word translated as "inquired" (darash) is said to be the middle word of the Torah. The essence of the Torah is continued inquiry and study. "The ideal Jew is not so much a learned Jew as a learning Jew." (Emet V'Emunah)

When I was in college sometimes I would attend class and either not be completely prepared or completely engaged. Both produced the same result, diminished learning. By not fully readying myself for the experience of learning I did myself a disservice for which I would later have to make up work. I would either have to go back and get notes from someone who was prepared or worse I would have to meet with the professor to figure out what he was talking about because I wasn't prepared in the first place. When we participate in a learning activity only in a half-hearted way we find the experience is somewhat unfulfilling.

There is work and there is home. It is recommended that we not bring the pressures and the stress of work home with us, even though we know that is impossible. In our ever compartmentalized lives we often separate parts of self that ought never be separated. What strikes me most about this approach is how we do this with our religious lives.

In many arenas of our lives we ask the difficult questions. We probe into the rationales and we question the motivations. Yet, when we enter the synagogue or other places of religious activity we check our inquisitive self at the door. We suggest there are questions that ought not be asked. Our text reminds us of the need for exploration. The text requires of us to remain engaged in our spiritual life with all of our capacities. Though we have a strong voice within our tradition that suggests there are behaviors, required activities in which we engage that are beyond our understanding (chukkim) I would suggest that we merely add two words to that statement. There are behaviors, required activities in which we engage that are <u>as yet</u> beyond our understanding. As it states in the paragraph leading up to the Shema. We must, I'Imod u'I'lamed, continue to learn and to teach. While we are on this journey towards full understanding of what our beliefs demand of us we must continue to learn. Like a body of water that has nothing flowing into it will soon dry up, so too if we do not encourage the flow of ideas through learning we too will dry up.

Continued access too our sacred tradition only comes through learning and our sacred legacy demands nothing short of full engagement.
