## "Star Wars and the Force of Jewish Life"

The people had yearned for this day for what felt like a lifetime. They could not hold back their excitement for the sounds, the sights and the experience of transcending reality.

If you think that I am talking about the Exodus unfolding in this week's parashat Vaera, then you may be surprised. I am describing the behavior and attitude of the millions of Americans who went to see *Star Wars: The Force Awakens* this past month.

This pop culture phenomenon surrounding *Star Wars*, which opened nearly forty years after the original, merits our attention. We can learn something significant about our approach to Jewish life from the sustained success of this franchise and the renewed interest stemming from the most recent movie.

Let's begin by asking: What is the pull of *Star Wars*? A good story, miraculous special effects, a moving soundtrack, and the heroes' sense of purpose are amongst the ingredients that have secured *Star Wars'* place in popular culture. Equally important, when viewing the most recent film with our sons, we noticed numerous families sitting together and sharing their passion for the series and characters with the next generation.

The elements of this movie can define an engaging spiritual community as much as an entertaining science fiction movie. There must be:

the potential for something miraculous at any given moment – emunah,

music that keeps you humming -ruach,

continuous insights - midrash,

a feeling of belonging - kehilah,

a mission to improve the world and the universe beyond- tikkun olam,

And the commitment to sharing the experience and the message with the next generation – mesorah le'dor vador.

In the Torah we find one of the most well known and powerful stories of all time, our story. As the Children of Israel prepare to leave Egypt, they witness special effects that still inspire us today.

What we learn from the latest installment in the *Star Wars* "canon" is that in order to stay relevant, a core story needs to be embraced regularly and passed down to the next generation. Moreover, the story itself must be thought of as "art in progress."

By viewing Jewish life as art, we Jews become artists. With every *mitzvah* we perform, with every word of Torah we study and with every prayer we utter, we add a brush stroke to the canvas of Jewish life. Since the *mitzvoth*, the commandments, are an occasion to see God's hand in the world, then our tradition informs us that every action, from the mundane to the most significant, has the potential to be embued with and to expand God's presence.

By developing committed, welcoming and supportive Jewish homes and communities, we create Jewish masterpieces that are not only inviting today, but that also can capture the imagination of the next generation.

Shabbat Shalom and, in the words of Luke Skywalker, "May the Force Be With You!"
