Kaveh el adon-ai chazak v'yaametz libecha vkaveh el adon-ai. (Psalm 27)

"Hope in the Lord; be strong, and let your heart be brave; yes hope in the Lord." (Translation of final verse of Pslam 27 by Philip Birnbaum)

"Hope in Adon-ai. Be strong, take courage, and hope in Adon-ai." (Translation of same verse in Siddur Sim Shalom)

"Hope in Hashem, strengthen yourself and he will give you courage; and hope in Hashem." (Translation of same verse in Art Scroll Siddur)

Though the names used for God change the translations are essentially the same, putting the punctuation in the same places. Yet the Hebrew without punctuation can lend itself to a slightly altered version. Rabbi Eliseo Rozenwasser remarked, if you simply place the comma after the word chazak (which means to be strong) rather than before it (like every translation does) then the verse reads "May your faith in God be strong." Although this subtle reading may present a similar message to the message offered in each translation there is a difference.

With this reading the prayer asks for our belief to be strengthened. It asks that when our faith falters that God sustain it. This is a time of year that requires great focus and attention to the details of our lives. This time of year requires evaluation and analysis and the scrutiny can leave us with a sense of failure. When we weigh out each of positive actions with our negative ones we may be left in despair. We may choose to discard the entire system because we cannot succeed. To which the Psalmist asks for strong belief.

Faced with the challenges to our conviction we all need a boost to our trust and assurance in Divine kindness. At this time of year may each of us find that increase in confidence that will propel us into the new year with joy and celebration.
