Hilchot Tisha B'Av

- ◆ No eating, drinking, washing, anointing, wearing leather shoes, marital relations, or extending greetings.
- ◆ No learning Torah, except for sections dealing with the destruction of the Temple; i.e. The Book of Eicha and the account of the destruction in Tractate Gittin (56a-58a).
- ◆ No tallit and tefillin in the morning. We do, however, put them on at Mincha on Tisha B'Av afternoon.
- ◆ No sitting on chair of normal height until Chatzot (1:02pm on Tuesday).

Hilchot Erev Tisha B'Av - Seudah HaMafseket, The Final Meal

On Monday afternoon a regular meal is eaten, which may not include meat or wine. Following benching, a special meal consisting of bread and a hard boiled egg with ashes is eaten while sitting on the floor. You do not have to take off your shoes for the meal. The meal must conclude before 8:09pm.
